
Merry Christmas! I pray that this year's celebration of the birth of Christ may bring you and your loved ones joy! In the midst of the darkness the Northern hemisphere experiences at the winter solstice, we celebrate the ray of light that has dawned on the human race with the birth of Jesus our Savior. Unto us a Son is given! And they will name Him Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Prince of Peace! These themes of joy, light, salvation, hope, and tenderness come out in all of the many ways we celebrate this feast day. In the middle of our gloom and darkness, we are given many reminders of the gift that our God has given to us of His very self. This is a season of nostalgia and tradition, where signs and symbols, such as trees and wreaths and sounds and sayings, resound in our ears - from Christmas carols to greetings of "Merry Christmas."


This is truly a blessed time. It's also a season of gift-giving, in recognition of the fact that we ourselves have been given the greatest gift, God Emmanuel, God-with-us, Jesus, God who saves. In keeping with this tradition of giving gifts, we have had the custom of giving the gift of a book at Christmas time.
