Pastor's Notes: Seminarian Daniel Cooper's Vocation Story



Mr. Daniel Cooper, a seminarian of the Diocese of Knoxville, who has been studying at St. Meinrad Seminary, has been assigned to serve at the Basilica of Sts. Peter and Paul this summer. Daniel's home parish is St. John Neumann in Knoxville, the parish where I was raised. Daniel will be serving in our Masses, ministries and aspects of parish life over this summer until he returns to seminary. I asked him to share with us a few words about his journey up to this point in following the call to the priesthood. Please join in welcoming Daniel Cooper to our parish this summer, and keep him in your prayers as he serves among us.

Seminarian Daniel Cooper Vocation Story

I was born a Jew and spent several years studying in preparation for bar mitzvah prior to leaving and becoming a Christian. As a young child we celebrated all of the standard Jewish holidays and always found time to study Jewish history. I consider these formative years to be one of the best assets I had when becoming a Christian because they allowed me to understand the history that had come before. After becoming a Christian at a young age, around 8 years old, I dove headlong into learning all that I could. This eventually led to me teaching different classes and topical studies. Just before my 18th birthday I was offered a position as an associate pastor with the church and continued with that for a number of years.

However, something felt as though it were missing despite my best efforts to be present with the community I was entrusted with. I would come to discover this was the sacraments and the truth of the Catholic



Church during a summer mission trip experience. I began a very intensive journey reading everything I could possibly find about the Church. The more I read I was convinced that it was where I was always meant to be.

After giving up my pastorate and becoming Catholic I continued working in my career in banking while attending Mass as often as possible and working with the RCIA team and many other ministries. Over time, many different people continually asked me if I had ever considered the priesthood. I was sure they couldn't be talking about me, especially as a convert. I had been quite successful in my past life at pulling Catholics away from the Church, and I was sure that God would not want to have someone like me representing Him and His Church. However, more and more people continued to ask the question. I found a spiritual director and began a long dialogue with him about these matters.

Ultimately, it was decided that I would never know unless I tried. I applied to the diocese, and eventually to St. Meinrad Seminary and School of Theology. I kept telling myself that at some point along the way someone would say no. To date this has still not occurred, and I am continuing to move forward in formation. At this point, I have less time remaining in seminary than I have already been in, and I could not be happier. I feel as though God has been leading me toward this path all throughout my life. The road has been long and winding, but the journey has been very much worth it so far. My best advice to anyone considering what they may be called to in life is this: give it a shot! You will never know whether or not you are meant for something until you trust God and try it. He will provide everything you need if it is what you are meant to be doing and you will not regret the decision.




