Why Ashes?

On Wednesday we will mark the beginning of Lent with Ash Wednesday. Interestingly, this day is one of the busiest of the year for Catholic churches but where did we get the custom of receiving ashes?

By the eighth century, those who were about to die were laid on the ground on top of sackcloth and sprinkled with ashes. The priest would bless the dying person with holy water, saying, "Remember that thou art dust and to dust thou shalt return." After the sprinkling, the priest asked, "Art thou content with sackcloth and ashes in testimony of thy penance before the Lord in the day of judgment?" To which the dying person replied, "I am content."

The symbolism of mourning, mortality and penance is clear. Eventually, the use of ashes was adapted to mark the beginning of Lent, the 40-day preparation period (not including Sundays) for Easter.

In our present liturgy for Ash Wednesday, we use ashes made from the burned palm branches distributed on the Palm Sunday of the previous year. The priest blesses the ashes and imposes them on foreheads, making the sign of the cross and saying, "Remember, you are dust and to dust you shall return," or "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

As we begin this holy season of Lent in preparation for Easter, we strive to convert our hearts to the Lord by renewing the promises made at our baptism, when we died to an old life and rose to a new life with Christ.

"How to" Mass

We come to Mass each Sunday but have we ever had a chance to learn why we do the things we do? Why are there bells at certain parts of the Mass? Why do we need candles? How many different Eucharistic Prayers are there and when should we use them? Why do we omit the "Gloria" during Advent and Lent? What is an epiclesis? Or anamnesis? Where does Mass get its name?

Our faith is steeped in two millennia of tradition and the more we know the deeper we can delve into the spiritual life. During Lent, on Saturdays at 10am we will be celebrating teaching Masses, covering different aspects of the liturgy each week. Please join us for a spiritual and enriching experience

Special note: there will not be a Saturday morning Mass on March 4.


