Thoughts on Today's Readings

7:30pm

The most important disciples of Jesus were fishermen, owners of their boats, workers who knew what they were doing. They knew how to fish and how to handle the waters of the sea of Galilee. After feeding more than 5000 men, women, and children, Jesus went up the mountain to pray. Jesus sent his disciples off in a boat without him. The wind and waves had impeded progress and suddenly, they saw Jesus coming toward them across the wind-whipped waters. Gripped by fear, they thought he was a ghost.

These disciples were committed followers of Jesus who were worn out, frustrated. They saw Jesus go up a mountain to pray. What else could they think when they saw a human figure walking toward them through the storm? Jesus had never done anything like this before. They were terrified. Jesus told them not to be afraid, and Peter, in what appeared to be an idiotic move, asked to come to Jesus on the water. Jesus called him to come. In the storm, he climbed out of the boat and began to walk to Jesus. As long as he kept his eye on Jesus, everything was fine. But then, the wind, the tumbling waves paralyzed Peter with fear, and he began to sink. Jesus reached out a strong hand. Both continued and, as they climbed in the boat, the storm abated.

This is a community story. All were terrified. Their hearts were in their throats as Peter climbed over the side. But then, he returned! Some problems in the family, parish, school, or work community are best solved through conversation or professional help. But sometimes, when a problem persists and people feel weary and tense, someone has to step right into the middle of the problem, a risky step. The key to this gospel story is the word of Jesus: "Come." Now? Yes! Do not be afraid, and come! And so, the storm calms.


