Thoughts on Today's Readings

Like Peter, followers of Jesus must come to grips with the fact that Christian living is not attractive to people making judgments based on 'what's in it for me?' We cannot blindly follow trends but must go forward to the next place God calls us. We judge risks by whether this decision helps us to follow Christ more closely. We refuse to make judgments based on a safe common sense way to work things out. Worshipping the Lord with your body, your very life, is not a sure bet with an early payoff.

We are nourished by a stream within our hearts that flows deep and pure. It calls us to bold living. Like Jeremiah, we can try to silence that voice within because it can be terribly inconvenient. We should pray that God's word burns within, making us uncomfortable when we try to suppress it. This is what the saying about 'gaining the world but losing your soul' is about. It is a real and costly struggle that all followers will enter.

When we come to a crossroad, it is important that we listen to the words of God's Spirit. Common sense wisdom and the best of worldly advice is not what always leads to life in abundance. Daily prayer, reading the Scriptures, and the witness of the saints instruct us about what it means to follow Jesus. The church community offers many examples of those who have chosen rightly, refusing to lose their souls to gain worldly respect. Who do we consult when it comes to the big decisions in our lives?



First Fridays

In the late 17th century, St. Margaret Mary
Alacoque, who had experienced a childhood filled
with illness and a difficult home life, decided to
reject the possibility of marriage. Instead, she joined
the Order of the Visitation nuns. She had a rocky
start in her vocation but eventually found her rhythm
in the monastery where she lived. Then, she started
having visions.

These visions were of Jesus, asking her to spread the word about devotions to his Sacred Heart. As Catholics, we understand this to mean the entire mystery of Christ and everything about Jesus: Son of God, Savior, part of the Trinity, and our salvation. The Church celebrates the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost. As you may have guessed from that oddly specific dating, Fridays are an important part of the Sacred Heart devotion and Sister Margaret Mary's vision.

In her visions, Jesus asked her to share his promises of good things that could happen if we could spread this devotion. This was a time when most people received the Eucharist only rarely, and it created new interest in both the sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation.
