Thoughts on Today's Readings


The wise men were lifelong students tracking the stars, studying holy books, and motivated to action by the inner wisdom of their dreams. It is amazing to count the ways in which Matthew's Christmas story happens because of people's dreams. However, scholarly study and attention to dreams comes to nothing if it is not accompanied by action.

Dreams and action! Our thoughts developing what to do and the following actions which make the future happen. Joseph was a gentle and kind man who followed his gut deciding not to divorce Mary because she was pregnant. On his own, he decided that. Then came the dream, overcoming his fears, and so, when he awoke, he married Mary as the angel directed him to do. So a good man decides NOT to do something by taking time to reflect, and then, due to a dream, he decides to ACT.

What about the chief priests and scholars? How did they combine study, knowledge, and action? Herod ordered them to find where the Messiah was to be born. Collectively, they agreed upon the answer. "Tell the wise men to go to Bethlehem." And that was it! They didn't follow up at all. No action. Can our scripture study end up like that?

Now watch a man of action, Herod, welcoming the wise men and listening carefully. He asked scholars for help. All the while, he planned evil. He asked the wise men to return to share what they found. When they didn't, he went on a killing spree – action informed by fear and self-preservation rather than holy dreams.

When unscrupulous people, centered on what they seek for themselves act, and good people passively watch, peace can be shattered. May we combine head, heart, dreams, and action in finding our path in today's world as peacemakers.

William Alexander "Aleck" Van Hook, age 87, of Knoxville, TN passed away unexpectedly on Monday, December 18, 2023.

Born in Patterson, N.J. on January 14, 1936, he lived in many different states before the family settled near Worcester, Massachusetts.

He graduated from the College of the Holy Cross with degrees in Philosophy and Chemistry and from Johns Hopkins University with a Ph.D. in Physical Chemistry. While working at Brookhaven National Laboratory, he met his wife, Nancy Ashton, and married in 1962. He accepted a professorship in Physical Chemistry at the University of Tennessee where he had a long and distinguished career as a teacher and researcher. He was a Fulbright scholar, NAS scholar, Senate Faculty President, and a member of Phi Beta Kappa, the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and the American Chemical Society.

Aleck and his wife shared a love of adventure to many parts of the world and his work allowed him to travel extensively through North America, Europe, and Asia. As an outdoor enthusiast, he enjoyed boating, golfing, and snow skiing. He was also an avid reader, loved the opera, and was an active member of Saint John XXIII University Parish where he fostered many long-lasting friendships.

He is preceded in death by his parents, Andrew and Leonora Van Hook, and his daughter, Anne Marie. He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Nancy, his sons Mark with wife Cheri and Jonathan with wife Tracey, and his 4 grandchildren, James and his wife Ruby, Caroline, Eleanor, and Andrew. He is also survived by his siblings, Jane, Andrew "Buck", Sue, Leonora, all of whom live in New England, and their families.

Epiphany

The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek epiphainen, a verb that means "to shine upon," "to manifest," or "to make known." Thus, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11).

Pope Francis' 2024 Peace Day Message

For his 2024 World Day of Peace message, Pope Francis has chosen to reflect on the theme "Artificial Intelligence and Peace".

"New digital tools are even now changing the face of communications, public administration, education, consumption, personal interactions, and countless other aspects of our daily lives," he notes.

The Pope also urges world leaders to put in place policies that ensure AI development will "ultimately serve the cause of human fraternity and peace."

"It is my prayer at the start of the New Year that the rapid development of forms of artificial intelligence will not increase cases of inequality and injustice all too present in today's world, but will help put an end to wars and conflicts, and alleviate many forms of suffering that afflict our human family," he said.
