
Reflection:

When the harvest is ready, you need workers, and you need a plan. Jesus had a sense that people were yearning for the good news of God's kingdom. He hoped to visit all these towns but to test their readiness, he sent out 72 followers (two by two) to announce how close the reign of God was to them. The missionaries, from many different backgrounds, set out with the clothes on their back, nothing more. He instructed that when you get to your assigned town, share my peace with a family and stay with them. Bring healing love to the sick and suffering and announce that God's kingdom is so close that you can feel it.

The missionaries came back to report success and, in their willingness to share the good news, Jesus felt the presence of God's power. He announces, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from the sky." You, my messengers, without money, food or even shoes – defeated him. Be very joyful.

Of course there is another side to all this. When a community (note that they are not trying to bring good news to one person at a time but to the community) refuses to receive you, derides your message, or tells you to leave, shake off even the dust of that town. Do not let the experience and its hurts scar your spirit. Leave. Forget about it. But stay with the mission.

Two by two is how it works. Share the Lord's peace. Attend to the sick and suffering. Share your God-given talents. Failures will happen. Let them go and keep on walking. This is how Jesus accomplished Satan's fall. In the turbulence and devastation of war, or in bitter campaigns to enforce morality, Satan can get stronger. Joyful sharing in God's name by couples in their own neighborhoods might be the best way to bring about Satan's downfall. Charles Mulligan






