### **Catholic Response to Climate Change**

The Season of Creation began earlier this month with World Day of Prayer for Care of Creation on September 1 and continues through the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, October 4. The theme for this year's Season of Creation is "Peace with Creation." This year's Season of Creation takes place as the Church marks both the 800th anniversary of Saint Francis' "Canticle of Creation" and the 10th anniversary of Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si'.

In East Tennessee, Bishop Mark Beckman in June appointed a Commission for Creation Care to continue and expand the ministry of Care for Creation in our Diocese. The Commission is composed of representatives of Catholic Response to Climate Change and parishes engaged in Creation Care. Commissioners are meeting this month to begin planning an agenda focusing on the work and activities for Care for Creation in the Diocese of Knoxville.

The Catholic Response to Climate Change Committee meets on the second Thursday of the month on Zoom at 7:30 p.m. Members of all Catholic parishes are invited and encouraged to participate. We welcome your ideas!

**Justice Knox** is a coalition of local faith congregations who believe that in addition to doing works of mercy, our faith calls us to work for Justice as Jesus and the Prophets of the Old Testament showed us. Over twenty congregations are working to do just that. Together we have made our officials aware of the needs of our community. Some of the actions and commitments we have gotten from our local officials are:

- · Crisis Intervention Training for all city and county patrol officers
- · Dedicated funds of \$50,000,000 over 10 years from the city to for affordable housing.
- · \$300,000 of city money for eviction prevention this year
- $\cdot$  \$500,000 of county money for emergency rental assistance this year
- · Mental Health summit
- · Coordinated information system with all agencies that serve the homeless
- · Contract between the Knox County Schools and the International Institute of Restorative Discipline to address discipline disparities.

We continue to monitor these commitments and also work on Violence Reduction and Transportation needs.

Our parish Justice Knox Team will have House Meetings from September 16-October 19. This is an opportunity to learn more about what we do and what you can do to get involved. 


