Prayer of St. Michael the Archangel

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray. And do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls.
Amen.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The following words are attributed to St. Anthony the Great, an Egyptian hermit who lived in the 3rd century: *“A time is coming when men will go mad, and when someone who is not mad, they will attack him, saying, you are mad; you are not like us.”* If these words seem inverted, it is because they are. That time may have come. That time may be upon us. This should compel us to seek sanity in an insane world.

Today, we must embrace a radical change that will bring peace and tranquility to our souls, hopefully to the souls of those we love, and to the soul of our nation. The Church is at a crossroads. Her voice in the mission may weaken her if she loses herself in a subtle, yet real, diabolical disorientation. On the other hand, if she finds herself humbly opened to God’s Spirit, she becomes a force to be reckoned with, having placed herself unapologetically under the Lordship and Kingship of Christ Jesus. The Church would have to embrace the reality the Lord spoke of in his farewell discourse to the disciples before making His descent to the Garden of Gethsemane: *“If you belong to me, the world will not accept you as its own and you will be hated on account of my name.”*

If we are not under the Lordship and Kingship of Jesus Christ, we would be remiss in thinking dialogue, compromising with the spirit of the age, or that of any other religion, will bring us the world’s love. Moreover, it will merely take us farther away from God and further into the grip of falsehood. We will be entrapped, bound, and enslaved in the world’s madness. Christ is the full way, the full truth, and the full life, transforming us to make a noble contribution to the overall well-being of society and bringing peace and tranquility to the soul. He is God who came to us in the flesh of our humanity. There is no place for religious syncretism in the Church.

Jesus ends the Gospel this Sunday with these words, “You cannot serve two masters. You will either hate one and love the other or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon.” Is this not the heart of the problems we face in our lives today, both individually and collectively speaking? Idolatry abounds in a multiplicity of ways.

St. Paul, in his Letter to Timothy, calls us to pray for those in authority over us that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in devotion and dignity. Those authorities would be in the secular realm of society, as well as our religious leaders. Today, there is so much anxiety and confusion – so much unrest. People intuitively sense a tribulation on the rise that is disturbing people into lethargy and despair. To whom do we go? To whom do we turn? When we neglect God, we find ourselves ignorant of God. This leaves us trapped in vices in an attempt to close the wounds of life. We would fill the emptiness with a falsehood that would rob our lives of meaning and purpose.

The solution can be found in the following words quoted from a variety of our ancestors, including the late Pope Francis:

“Though it may seem obvious, we should remember that holiness consists in a habitual openness to the transcendent, expressed in prayer and adoration. The saints are distinguished by a spirit of prayer and a need for communion with God. They find an exclusive concern with this world to be narrow and stifling, and, amid their own concerns and commitments, they long for God, losing themselves in praise and contemplation of the Lord. I do not believe in holiness without prayer, even though prayer need not be lengthy or involve intense emotions.”

St. John of the Cross tells us: *“Endeavor to remain always in the presence of God, insofar as is permitted by your works.”* In the end, our desire for God will surely find expression in our daily lives: “Try to be continuous in prayer, and in the midst of bodily exercises do not leave it: Whether you eat, drink, talk with others, or do anything, always go to God and attach your hearts to him.”

For this to happen, however, some moments spent alone with God are necessary. St. Teresa of Avila defines prayer as nothing but a friendly encounter, and frequent solitary converse, with Him who we know loves us. She insists that this is true not only for a privileged few, but for all of us, for we all have need of this silence, filled with the presence of him who is adored. Trust-filled prayer is a response of a heart open to encountering God face to face, where all is peaceful, and the quiet voice of the Lord can be heard in the midst of silence.

In that silence, we can discern, in the light of the Spirit, the paths of holiness to which the Lord is calling us. Otherwise, any decisions we make may only be window-dressing that, rather than exalting the Gospel in our lives, will mask or submerge it. For each disciple, it is essential to spend time with the Master, to listen to his words, and to learn from him always. Unless we listen, all our words will be nothing but useless chatter.

God’s word invites us clearly to “stand against the wiles of the devil” (Eph.6:11) and to “quench all the flaming darts of the evil one” (Eph.6:16). These expressions are not melodramatic, precisely because our path toward holiness is a constant battle. Those who do not realize this will be prey to failure or mediocrity. For this spiritual combat, we can count on the powerful weapons that the Lord has given us: faith-filled prayer, meditation on the word of God, the offering of Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, works of charity, community life, and missionary outreach.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Las siguientes palabras se atribuyen a San Antonio el Grande, ermitaño egipcio del siglo III: *“Llegará un tiempo en que los hombres enloquecerán, y si alguien no está loco, lo atacarán, diciendo: Estás loco; no eres como nosotros”. Si estas palabras parecen invertidas, es porque lo están. Puede que ese momento haya llegado. Puede que ese momento esté sobre nosotros. Esto debería impulsarnos a buscar la cordura en un mundo demente.*

Hoy debemos abrazar un cambio radical de la única manera en que ese cambio traerá paz y tranquilidad a nuestra alma, ojalá a las almas de quienes amamos y de nuestra nación. La Iglesia se encuentra en una encrucijada. Su voz en la misión puede debilitarse si se pierde en una desorientación diabólica, sutil pero real. Por otro lado, si se abre humildemente al Espíritu de Dios, se convierte en una fuerza a tener en cuenta, habiéndose colocado sin complejos bajo el Señorío y Reinado de Cristo Jesús. La Iglesia tendría que abrazar la realidad que el Señor mencionó en su discurso de despedida a Sus discípulos antes de descender al Huerto de Getsemaní: *“Si son míos, el mundo no los aceptará como suyos y serán odiados por mi causa”.*

Si nos sometemos con disculpas al Señorío y Reinado de Jesucristo, ningún diálogo ni compromiso con el espíritu de esta época ni con el de ninguna otra religión, nos traerá el amor del mundo. Simplemente nos alejará aún más de Dios y nos hundirá más en las garras de la falsedad. Estaremos atrapados, atados y esclavizados en la locura del mundo. Cristo es el camino, la verdad y la vida plena que nos transforma para contribuir noblemente al bienestar general de la sociedad y traer paz y tranquilidad al alma. Él es Dios que vino a nosotros en la carne de nuestra humanidad. No hay lugar para el sincretismo religioso en la Iglesia. Jesús termina el Evangelio de este domingo con estas palabras: *“No se puede servir a dos señores. O se odia a uno y se ama al otro, o bien se es fiel a uno y se desprecia al otro. No se puede servir a Dios y al dinero”. ¿No es este el núcleo de los problemas que enfrentamos hoy en día, tanto individual como colectivamente? La idolatría abunda de muchas maneras.*

San Pablo, en su Carta a Timoteo, nos llama a orar por quienes tienen autoridad sobre nosotros para que podamos llevar una vida tranquila y apacible, con devoción y dignidad. Esas autoridades estarían en el ámbito secular de la sociedad, así como en nuestros líderes religiosos. Hoy en día hay mucha ansiedad, confusión e inquietud. La gente percibe intuitivamente una tribulación creciente que los está perturbando y sumiendo en el aturdimiento y la desesperación. ¿A quién vamos? ¿A quién nos dirigimos? El haber rechazado nutrirnos de la vida en Dios hasta el punto de que existe tanta ignorancia de Dios deja a demasiadas personas atrapadas en vicios que intentan cerrar las heridas de la vida y llenar el vacío sólo para profundizar en una vida vacía de sentido y propósito.

La solución se encuentra en estas palabras citadas por alguien que no conozco:

“Aunque parezca obvio, debemos recordar que la santidad consiste en una apertura habitual a lo trascendente, expresada en la oración y la adoración. Los santos se distinguen por un espíritu de oración y una necesidad de comunión con Dios. Consideran que una preocupación exclusiva por este mundo es estrecha y sofocante, y, en medio de sus propias preocupaciones y compromisos, anhelan a Dios, perdiéndose en la alabanza y la contemplación del Señor. No creo en la santidad sin oración, aunque esta no tiene por qué ser larga ni implicar emociones intensas.

San Juan de la Cruz nos dice: “Procurad permanecer siempre en la presencia de Dios, en la medida en que vuestras obras lo permitan”. Al final, nuestro deseo de Dios seguramente encontrará expresión en nuestra vida diaria: “Procurad ser constantes en la oración, y en medio de las ocupaciones corporales no la abandonéis: ya sea que comáis, bebáis, habléis con otros o hagáis cualquier otra cosa, id siempre a Dios y unid vuestro corazón a él”.

Para que esto suceda, sin embargo, son necesarios momentos a solas con Dios. Para Santa Teresa de Ávila, la oración *“no es más que un encuentro amistoso y una frecuente conversación solitaria con Aquel que sabemos que nos ama. Insisto en que esto es cierto no solo para unos pocos privilegiados, sino para todos nosotros, pues todos necesitamos este silencio, lleno de la presencia de Aquel que es adorado”.* La oración llena de confianza es la respuesta de un corazón abierto al encuentro con Dios cara a cara, donde todo es paz y la voz serena del Señor se escucha en medio del silencio.

En ese silencio, podemos discernir, a la luz del Espíritu, los caminos de santidad a los que el Señor nos llama. De lo contrario, cualquier decisión que tomemos puede ser solo una fachada de que, en lugar de exaltar el Evangelio en nuestras vidas, lo enmascarará o lo suprimirá. Para cada discípulo es esencial pasar tiempo con el Maestro, escuchar sus palabras y aprender siempre de él. Si no escuchamos, nuestras palabras serán palabrería inútil.

La palabra de Dios nos invita claramente a *“resistir contra las asechanzas del diablo” (Efesios 6:11)* y a *“apagar todos los dardos de fuego del maligno” (Efesios 6:16).* Estas expresiones no son melodramáticas, precisamente porque nuestro camino hacia la santidad es una batalla constante. Quienes no se dan cuenta de esto serán presa del fracaso o la mediocridad. Para esta lucha espiritual, podemos contar con las poderosas armas que el Señor nos ha dado: la oración con fe, la meditación de la palabra de Dios, el ofrecimiento de la Misa, la Adoración Eucarística, la Reconciliación sacramental, las obras de caridad, la vida comunitaria y el trabajo misionero.
