

Dear Parishioners,

I've just completed two months as the administrator of the parish. There are a lot of things to learn. Within this short period, I've focused on some of the important concerns: reworked the financial budget, addressed the issues of the use of our parish buildings. Extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion, meeting with building and ground committee to focus on the things to be done, a couple of meetings with religious education program coordinators, hiring parish Maintenance person etc. I notice that there is a lot of positive energy in our parish community. Thank you for the welcome cake for me and for Bishop Bradley to our community. I could see and feel the happiness of the people who participated in the parish picnic. I am writing to express my sincere gratitude to every one of you, for your continued support to our church community. Your generosity and commitment to our mission is truly inspiring.

I thank our church staff members. Wonderful and very hard-working people, generous enough to give their time and energy for the good of our parish.

Every parish must have a finance council. I'm in the process of strengthening our finance committee. I'll be adding a few members, let me know if anyone with a financial background is interested in being part of the finance council.

I'll be forming a new parish Pastoral Council. Cannon Law 514§2. states the pastoral council is to be convoked at least once a year. Once our parish council is established, we will have a meeting every three months.

My focus is to establish different parish committees and get one member from each committee to represent the parish pastoral committee.

I want to establish for the good of our parish the following committees:

- **1.** Liturgy and worship committee: Representatives from all the choir members, Sacristans, Ushers, Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion all come under the worship committee that looks into all liturgical celebrations in our church.
- 2. Faith formation Team: This team will focus on Faith Formation for the children and adults, ongoing formation, lent retreat, talks etc.
- **3.** Building and Ground Committee: We already have an active building and ground committee. If anyone is interested in being part of the committee, contact the parish office.
- **4.** Stewardship Committee (parish fund-raising): This team will explore various resources available in our community and also focus on parish fund-raising activities.
- **5.** Parish Hospitality Committee: This committee will focus on funeral lunch, special events like feast days, parish picnic, anything that involves food and welcoming.
- **6.** Hispanic Ministry: This group will focus on strengthening the Hispanic Ministry in our parish.

I hope these outlines will give you an idea in which direction I want our parish to move forward. I count on your support and cooperation. Please be generous to accept my invitation to be part of any of these committees. God wants us to share our three T's: Time, Talents and Treasures.

The parish Pastoral Council will have representatives from the above committees. Therefore, it will take time to form the parish pastoral council.

Your generosity makes a real difference in the lives of so many people. I'll be happy If I don't need to talk too often about the financial needs of our parish. You all know what to do. Thank you for being such a vital part of our church community. Your support for me and for our church is more important than ever.
