

Explore the World of Reading

Students should continue to select reading materials that are at the right reading level. One great source for parents and students is http://www.scholastic.com/bookwizard/. This site will guide parents to look up the title of the book, understand the content of the story and level of the book.

Enjoy your summer and remember to pick up a book and have fun creating a book project.

Choose One

- Write a summary of what you read. Be sure to include: main characters, setting, problem, resolution and a brief plot. Use evidence from your book to support your ideas
- Create a Book Trailer to sell the book to a fellow student
- Create a comic strip of a favorite scene that shows the character, situation and setting
- Draw your favorite scene from the book and describe why it's a favorite scene
- Write a new chapter of the book that shows what happens next or is told from another character's perspective
- Create a Character: Use a paper plate and attached circles to tell the name of the book, name of character, what he/she looks like, what he/she did in the story, why or why not you would like to meet the character, was it a real or make believe character?
- Create your own project: Be creative--is there another way you would like to show how much you enjoyed the book?








