*We sing in church as an expression of faith. Our singing is rooted to early Christian traditions where worshipers gathered to sing hymns and psalms. It has evolved and serves as our spiritual anchor in worship. Our singing is designed to elevate our minds and souls toward the divine, creating an atmosphere of prayer. Our liturgy is sung or chanted, which sets the tone for our worship. Cantors and Priests often chant the Epistle and Gospel slowly to communicate the message of God, making the experience feel like a conversation with God. This emphasizes the sacredness of the liturgy and encourages participation from the people. Our music also serves to connect worshippers to their heritage. As the chant tradition has developed, it has incorporated local customs enriching worship. This blend of tradition and modernity allows the faithful to feel a sense of belonging and connection to their ancestors. Our singing is an expression of faith, brings our community together and connects people to their spiritual roots, culture and heritage. This plays a central role in the liturgical life of our church.*
