### **Lesson**

A reading from the Second Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians

#### **2 Cor. 6:1-10**

Brethren: We entreat you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For He says, In an acceptable time I have heard you, and in the day of salvation I have helped you. Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation! We give no offense to anyone, that our ministry may not be blamed. On the contrary, let us conduct ourselves in all circumstances as God's ministers, in much patience; in tribulations, in hardships, in distresses; in stripes, in imprisonments, in tumults; in labors, in sleepless nights, in fastings; in innocence, in knowledge, in long-sufferings; in kindness, in the Holy Spirit, in unaffected love; in the word of truth, in the power of God; with the armor of justice on the right hand and on the left; in honor and dishonor, in evil report and good report; as deceivers and yet truthful, as unknown and yet well known, as dying, and behold, we live, as chastised but not killed, as sorrowful yet always rejoicing, as poor yet enriching many, as having nothing yet possessing all things.

Then the devil took Him into the holy city and set Him on the pinnacle of the temple, and said to Him, If You are the Son of God, throw Yourself down; for it is written, 'He has given His angels charge concerning You; and upon their hands they shall bear You up, lest You dash Your foot against a stone.' Jesus said to him, It is written further, 'You shall not tempt the Lord your God.' Again, the devil took Him to a very high mountain, and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world and the glory of them. And he said to Him, All these things will I give You, if You will fall down and worship me. **LENTEN LETTER  
FROM THE VICE RECTOR**



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we begin the season of Lent, we are reminded of the great sacrifice that Our Lord Jesus Christ made for us through His suffering and death on the cross. During this holy season, we are called to reflect on the temptations that Christ faced during His forty days in the desert, and to consider how we can follow in His footsteps by overcoming our own temptations and weaknesses.

In the Gospel of Matthew, we hear of Christ's encounter with the devil in the desert. 
