

### From the desk of Father Russell

Jesus continually opens our eyes beyond the limits, false hopes, and preoccupations of this world to something greater. Jesus keeps us grounded in the bigger picture and plugged into eternity. This is precisely what we need in order to find



the grace and energy to work toward a civilization of love here and now. It is important to care for ourselves as stewards and gifts of God, but there is something so much greater than ourselves that we must be willing to deny ourselves for it. And it is precisely in losing ourselves for God and neighbor that we find ourselves. Marriage is a beautiful gift cherished by many in every generation. We have to keep working on it. But there is something even greater than this great union and foundation for society and new life, and it is precisely in recognizing the something greater that marriages, families, new lives, culture, and society are protected, strengthened, nourished and renewed. "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise" (Luke 20:34-36).

Jesus is not, of course, saying that those who marry will not experience the gifts of eternity, just as he is not saying that we should not honor father or mother or take care of our health. What he is saying, is that if we want to experience the greatest gifts that God has to offer, we must be willing to look beyond the gifts we see to a deeper reality and a deeper union with God himself. The saints, including those who die for the faith, remind us of eternal life. The martyrs of 2 Maccabees in our first reading saw these deeper things even before they were able to witness the Son of God taking on humanity, dying and rising for them: "He put out his tongue at once when told to do so, and bravely held out his hands, as he spoke these noble words: 'It was from Heaven that I received these; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again."

Abraham Lincoln was greatly admired for his ability to look deeper than many and the courage to express what he saw. "'A house divided against itself cannot stand.' I believe this government cannot endure permanently half slave and half free. I do not expect the Union to be dissolved. I do not expect the house to fall – but I do expect it will cease to be divided. It will become all one thing or all the other" (speech accepting nomination to oppose Senator Stephen Douglas who won re-election, June 16, 1858). Our heart, hands, and feet cannot be permanently for the fallen world and for heaven

We must choose. We look to the Saints as the Holy Spirit guides us on our unique journey.



#### ST. GERTRUDE FEAST DAY - NOVEMBER 16

She was born in Eisleben, Germany, on January 6, 1256. Nothing is known of her parents, and at the age of five she was put under the auspices of the Benedictine nuns at Helfta and later became a nun in the same abbey. She was intelligent and studious and delighted in the study of languages, literature, philosophy, as well as music and painting. In 1281, at the age of twenty-five she underwent a conversion to follow the Lord more closely when



she experienced the first of a series of visions of Christ that would continue until the day she passed away. While in the chapel, she states: "where I was accustomed to make my lukewarm prayers, I heard these words: "I will save you and deliver you. Do not be afraid." From then on, she had numerous revelations and experiences of God's grace, which she wrote about in the Book of Extraordinary Grace, an account of her spiritual journey. She dedicated herself to the meditation of Scripture and liturgical texts. She had enjoyed a good education. She wrote and composed in Latin, and was versed in sacred literature. Her life, though not replete with stirring events and striking actions, was one of great mental activity. She was characterized by great devotion to the Sacred Humanity of our Lord and His Passion and in the Blessed Eucharist, and by a tender love for the Blessed Virgin. As she approached death, she wrote, "I am certain whether my death be sudden or foreseen, that I shall never be without the mercy of God." She died at Helfa on November 16, 1302. Although she was never formally canonized, Rome approved a liturgical office of prayer and readings in her honor. She is often invoked for souls in purgatory.
