

From the desk of Fr. Russell

The beginning of Wisdom is *fear* of the Lord (this refers to a "holy reverence" for the Mystery of our Lov-

ing God). The book of Wisdom gives us insight into the happenings of the "rich young man" who is faithful to the commandments but still unwilling to trust completely in God (letting go of reliance on what he "has" in this world – including his own merits): "I prayed, and prudence was given me; I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me. I preferred her to scepter and throne, and deemed riches nothing in comparison with her, nor did I liken any priceless gem to her; because all gold, in view of her, is a little sand, and before her, silver is to be accounted mire. Beyond health and comeliness I loved her" (Wisdom 7:7-10).

In our fallen nature we are warned about the influence of worldly things, which can corrupt us. This month we celebrate St. Bruno, founder of the Carthusians, who sought poverty both material and relational. They did not seek recognition except from God and relied upon Him. Distinguished as the Religious Order through many centuries that has never been reformed, perhaps a key to their success is their detachment even from worldly recognition. The "rich young man" is told by Jesus: "No one is good but God alone." We cannot even rely on our merits. And when asked by the disciples: "Then who can be saved?" Jesus responds: "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God." God wants all people saved and therefore needs us to turn to him, since we cannot save ourselves. May the Lord give us the grace to trust Him above all things in this world, and make us witnesses in union with Him.

St. Teresa of Jesus (Teresa of Ávila) Feast Day - October 15

She was born at Avila, Spain, on March 28, 1515, the daughter of an influential family. Lively and affectionate by nature, she made friends easily and adapted readily to any circumstance. As a child she was drawn to religion. She and her small brother avidly read the lives of saints and once even attempted to leave home to die for their faith among the Moors in Africa. They were quickly returned home. Her religious values weakened in her teenage years. In 1531, however, she suddenly decided to enter the



Carmelite monastery at Avila over her father's objection. She was professed in 1538. After a period of sickness and religious mediocrity, she began to experience great graces of prayer in her late thirties. She described her experiences with remarkable skill in writings that have become spiritual classics. Her Autobiography, The Way of Perfection, and The Interior Castle have inspired and guided countless people in their spiritual lives. She decided to reform her own Carmelite community with the help of Sts. Peter of Alcantara and John of the Cross and she established new monasteries throughout Spain. Despite much opposition she went about her task with a good disposition and great common sense. She was both a mystic and a practical apostle. As she lay dying, the Holy Eucharist was brought to her and she exclaimed, "O my Lord, now it is time that we may see each other." She died on October 4, 1582. She was beatified on April 24, 1614 by Pope Paul V and was canonized on March 12, 1622, along with three of her greatest contemporaries: St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Francis Xavier, and St. Philip Neri by Pope Gregory XV. She was declared a Doctor of the Church on September 27, 1970 by Pope Paul VI - the first of only four women to be so honored. She is the patron of headache sufferers

What is R.C.I.A.? (The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is the ordinary way in which adults who were not raised in the Catholic faith become fully initiated into the Roman Catholic Church through Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.
