From the desk of Fr. Russell

"Behold, I will bring them back from the land of the north; I will gather them from the ends of the world, with the blind and the lame in their

midst, the mothers and those with child; they shall return as an immense throng. They departed in tears, but I will console them and guide them" (Jeremiah 31:7-9).

We do not need to be perfect to be brought back – far from it! The "blind and the lame" will be included among those restored to the kingdom. We do not know if Bartimaeus read Jeremiah, but he knew he was blind and he knew Jesus could show him the way that he did not yet see. Jesus gives Bartimaeus the opportunity to witness in humility to his need: "Master, I want to see." Jesus then responds by pointing to the deeper inner sight that Bartimaeus already possesses: "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Bartimaeus can go his way in faith because his way is the way in which the "Light of the World" leads him. This path of faith brings salvation and the fullness of light and life. Those without the courage of Bartimaeus are not without hope. Children of God who want to be with God must be freed from attachments to fear, but with God they can still be saved. "When the Lord brought back the captives of Zion, we were like men dreaming. Then our mouth was filled with laughter, and our tongue with rejoicing" (Psalm 126). We are reminded to pray for those who have gone before us as well. Some may have groped as in darkness for the light. God finds a way where all may seem lost, and so we pray in hope for ourselves and those who have gone before us. "Purgatory is the state of those who die in God's friendship, assured of their eternal salvation, but who still have need of purification to enter into the happiness of heaven" explains the Compendium of the Catechism (210). "Because of the communion of saints, the faithful who are still pilgrims on earth are able to help the souls in purgatory by offering prayers in suffrage for them, especially the Eucharistic sacrifice. They also help them by almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance" (211). So whether it is in this world or beyond, we have the simple and profound means of coming to the assistance of one another, each of us seeking the light and path that leads us to "the happiness of heaven".


ALL SOULS' DAY November 2nd



ST. ALPHONSUS RODRIGUEZ

Feast Day - October 30

Born in 1533 in Spain, he inherited the family textile business at the age of 23. Within the space of three years, his wife, daughter, and mother died; meanwhile, business was poor and he sold



the business. He and his young son moved into his sister's home. There he learned the discipline of prayer and mediation. When his son died several years later, by then at the age of almost 40 he sought to join the Society of Jesus but was refused at Segovia. He was not helped by his poor education and on the advice of a Jesuit friend, he went back to grade school and abandoned an idea he had to become a hermit. He applied twice before being admitted to the Jesuits as a lay brother. He served in the lowly post as doorkeeper at the Jesuit's Montesión College on Majorca for 45 years. When he was not at his post, he was almost always at prayer, though he often encountered difficulties and temptations. He was soon known for his holiness, simplicity, obedience, and devotion to the Immaculate Conception. He was consulted on matters spiritual by both learned and simple people, including St. Peter Claver who put himself under Alphonsus' spiritual guidance for three years while he was a student at Montesión. He suffered from ill health the last years of his life until his death at Montesión on November 1, 1617. Tragedy and challenge beset this saint early in life, but he found happiness and contentment through simple service and prayer. He was canonized with Peter Claver in 1888 by Pope Leo XIII.
