From the desk of Fr. Russell

"For by one offering he has made perfect forever those who are being consecrated" (Hebrews 10:14). Christ's offering is one eternal offering that we

embrace and unite ourselves to in a special way at each Mass in time. Through Baptism our entire lives are consecrated to the offering of Christ which we join in joys, sorrows, mission, and glory. This offering finds its summit in this world at Mass. And so our serious obligation to join with other Christians (so obligated) as we are able (Christ and the Church do not demand the impossible) at least at Sunday and Holy Day Masses to adore our Creator and Savior and join with the other members of the Body of Christ; united in the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. "Therefore my heart is glad and my soul rejoices, my body, too, abides in confidence ... You will show me the path to life, fullness of joys in your presence, the delights at your right hand **forever**" declares the Psalmist (16) today. This is some of the fruit we hope will result by God's grace from our little efforts. "For only in this unity of the whole body of the Church can the liturgy's efficacy and authority be guaranteed. The pastors of the Church, by their willing fidelity to the norms and directives of the Church, and in a spirit of faith which abandons all personal and individual preferences are in an especial way the ministers of the common liturgy" (13). We encourage each member to be active in pursuing this unity and fullness of worship according to our means and God's merciful grace.

# St. Gertrude Feast Day, November 16

She was born in 1256 at Eisleben, Germany. Although little is known about her childhood, it is widely accepted that at just four years old, she was enrolled in the Cistercian monastery school of Helfta and later became a nun in the same abbey. She was known for being charming and able to win peo-



ple over. There she delighted in the study of the Latin language and literature as well as music and painting. At the age of twenty-five, she underwent a conversion to follow the Lord more closely. She began a life filled with humility, patience in suffering and care for others. She dedicated herself to the meditation of Scripture and liturgical texts and frequented the reading of the Fathers of the Church, including Augustine. In 1281, she experienced her first series of visions that would continue until the day she passed away. Her visions altered her life and she saw this moment as her new birth. Her priorities turned away from secular teachings and focused more on studying Scripture and theology. Her life became full with this awakening and she was an enthusiastic student, writing for the spiritual benefit of others. She once had a vision on the feast of John the Evangelist, described in her writings. As she rested her head near Jesus' wound on His side, she could hear the beating of His heart. She asked St. John if he, too, felt the beating of Jesus' Divine Heart on the night of the Last Supper. He told her he was saving this revelation for a time when the world needed it to rekindle its love. She went on to become one of the great mystics of the 13th century. Along with St. Mechtilde, she practiced what is known as "nuptial mysticism," seeing herself as the bride of Christ. She embraced charity for both rich and poor, she was a simple woman with a deep solidarity with those not yet ready for the beatific vision, who are still being purified in purgatory. She is often invoked for souls in purgatory. She died on November 17, 1301.
