

## From the desk of Deacon Steve

#### On Earth

In my last article I wrote about discerning God's will. I pointed out that this does not mean what is

my will, what is my political parties will, what is my countries will, but what is God's will? So, what is God's will in regard to the earth?

Genesis teaches us: "Then, God said Let the water under the sky be gathered into a single basin, so that dry land may appear...God called the dry land earth...God saw how good it was". Later God created man and women and gave them this charge. "Have dominion over all living things that move on the earth, all seed bearing plants and every tree...And so it happened God looked at everything he had made, and he found it very good." Care for creation, care for the very good earth, is part of Catholic Social Teaching, we are responsible for all the very good things that God created.

Could you find Seychelles on a map? How about Moldova, Burkina Faso? If you're like me, you would fail. I get lost going to the grocery store. But what I do know is that those lands were created by God, the people who inhabit those lands, were created in his image, and Jesus teaches that they are our neighbors, and we are to love our neighbor. We are to care for the planet that we all inhabit.

In 2015 Pope Francis issued an encyclical entitled Laudato Si. The title translates to 'Praise to you, my Lord'. The pope in his letter outlines our responsibility to care for earth, our common home. I would encourage all Catholics to read this letter. In part he talks about how the waste, and pollution of first world countries has a negative impact on third world countries. He talks about how so many countries lack such basics as clean drinking water, and adequate food, to meet the needs of the people in developing countries, to meet the needs of our brothers and sisters. We are charged then to care for all of God's creation, for He finds them very good. Our prayer then, is to meditate on ways we can help not only the needs of people, but also to work to change systems that are in place that allow the rich nations to profit at the expense of poorer countries. We are reminded that to whom much has been given much is expected.



# The 12 Days of Christmas BEGINS ON CHRISTMAS DAY AND ENDS ON EPIPHANY

#### **DID YOU KNOW?!**

Aside from the fact that Epiphany which comes twelve days after Christmas, used to mark the end of the Christmas Season, the "Twelve Days of Christmas" are not really any part of Catholic Liturgy.

The song of that name actually derives from a time in England from 1558 to 1829 when it was illegal to be a Catholic, and so the song contains a hidden teaching of Catholic theology. This was a way that parents could still secretly teach their children about the Catholic faith during that particular period.

#### A PARTRIDGE IN A PEAR TREE

The "True Love" one hears in the song is not a smitten boy or girlfriend, but Jesus Christ, because truly Love was born on Christmas Day. The partridge in the pear tree also represents Him because that bird is willing to sacrifice itself if necessary to protect its young by feigning injury to draw away predators.

#### **TWO TURTLE DOVES**

represents the Human and Divine natures of Christ and the two testaments of the Bible (Old and New).

#### THREE FRENCH HENS

symbolize the three theological virtues: faith, hope and love.

#### **FOUR CALLING BIRDS**

represent the four evangelists - Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

#### **FIVE GOLDEN RINGS**

represent the first five books of the Old Testament (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy), which gives the history of man's fall from grace

#### SIX GEESE A-LAYING

represent for the six days of creation.

#### **SEVEN SWANS A-SWIMMING**

represents the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit wisdom, knowledge, counsel, piety, fortitude, understanding, and fear of the Lord.

#### **EIGHT MAIDS A-MILKING**

represent the eight beatitudes taught by Jesus.

#### **NINE LADIES DANCING**

represent the Nine Orders (or Choirs) of Angels: Angels, Principalities, Archangels, Powers, Virtues, Dominions, Thrones, Cherubims, and Seraphims

#### **TEN LORDS A-LEAPING**

symbolize the Law of God; the Ten Commandments.

#### **ELEVEN PIPERS PIPING**

represent the eleven Faithful Apostles who stuck with Jesus when seemingly all others had abandoned Him.

## TWELVE DRUMMERS DRUMMING

represent the twelve basic beliefs of the Catholic Church as outlined in the Apostles' Creed.

## St. Peter Canisius Feast Day - December 21

He was born at Nijmegen, Holland (when it was part of Germany) on May 8, 1521 into a prominent political family. He studied Canon Law at Louvain and



received his master of arts degree at Cologne University in 1540. At the age of twenty-two he joined the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and distinguished himself in studies and spiritual perfection. He was ordained in 1546 and began a career of writing and preaching and went to the Council of Trent for two sessions as a delegate. He returned to Rome and was commissioned by St. Ignatius Loyola to teach at the first Jesuit school at Messina. He was the second great Apostle of Germany - the first being St. Boniface. He was a preacher, theologian, and leader of the Counter Reformation. His mission in Germany was to labor for the Church in its struggle with the Reformation. With astonishing clarity he saw that in order to combat the Reformation, the Church must first reform herself in her pastors and prepare generations of instructed laymen capable of defending their faith. He was a prolific writer and his famous catechism, or Summary of Christian Doctrine, which appeared in 1560 and went on to achieve two hundred editions before the turn of the century. He produced a number of well-known catechisms, theological writings, editions of writings of the early Church theologians, as well as controversial essays. He died at Fribourg, Switzerland on December 21, 1597 at the age of 76. Pope Pius XI canonized him on May 21, 1925, and proclaimed him a Doctor of the Church.
