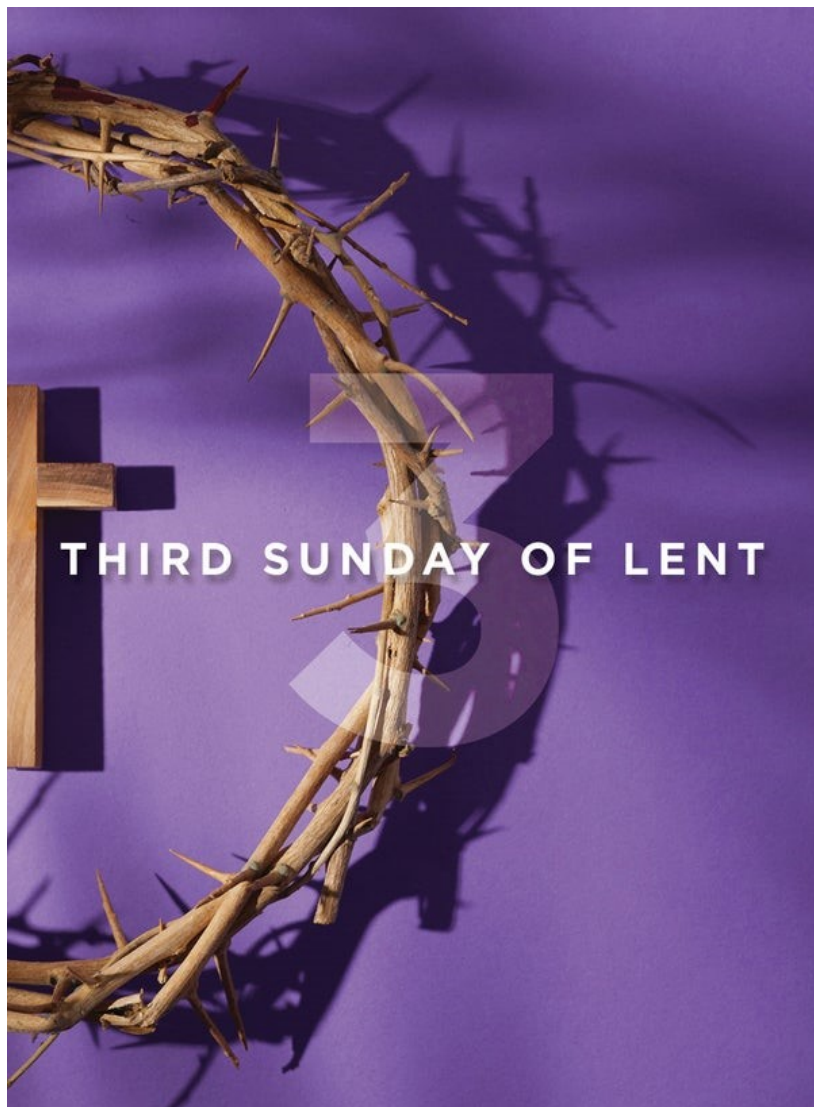

## From the desk of Deacon Steve

*As we Forgive those who trespass  
against us*



This is perhaps the most difficult line in the entire Our Father. To forgive. Yet we are reminded every time we say this prayer of our need for forgiveness, our need to recognize our sinfulness and to seek God's forgiveness. As we ask for daily bread, we ask for daily forgiveness. But we also ask daily for the grace to forgive. One writer has suggested that when we experience hurt from someone else sinning against us, we should imagine that same hurt that we cause when we sin against God.

We need to recognize that there is a difference between sin and crime. The former is a violation of God's commandments, and it is this that we are called to forgive. The latter is a matter for the legal system, and as a matter of justice, a penalty needs to be enacted. However, mercy requires that the punishment be restorative, and not simply punitive. Recall the sin of Adam and Eve, despite their rejection of God and his creation they were given a path to restoration, a path that led to our being restored to the kingdom through the sacrifice of Jesus.

As a matter of justice forgiving does not mean forgetting. That is not what Jesus is saying. We can forgive without forgetting. We can forgive someone while protecting ourselves from it happening again. Forgiving does not mean erasing the consequences.

Still, we know forgiveness is hard. But be assured forgiveness is a process not a one-time act. This prayer begins the process, but it can, and often is a very long process. It is something like grief in that way. It is a long process that looks different for everyone and cannot be rushed. Sister Eileen Reilly shared her experience dealing with the mothers of men who had been killed. She spoke of one woman who sank into such deep depression she turned to alcohol to numb the pain, which changed to rage at the person who had killed her son. She realized that if she were ever to be whole again, she needed to forgive. She eventually was able to meet the father of her son's killer and offered him her condolences. She realized they had both lost a child, and they were both in incredible pain.

The important lesson here is that when we begin the process of forgiveness, we begin the process of healing and that is Jesus real purpose in giving us this prayer, that we might experience the Father's healing as we offer that same healing to those who hurt us. The same Christ who offered forgiveness from the cross to those crucifying Him, also offered a guarantee of paradise to the repentant thief. This becomes our purpose for forgiving that we too might enter into the kingdom with our Lord.

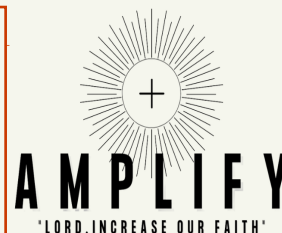

**Music, Hymns, and Canticles** by Stephen Binz

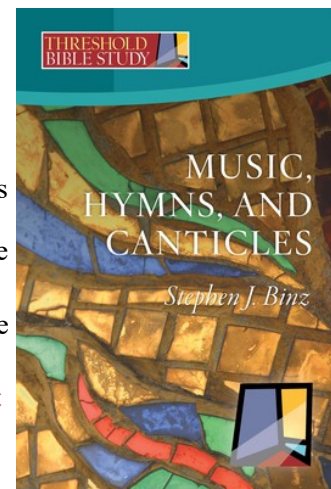
The Women's Faith Study Group will be discussing this book.

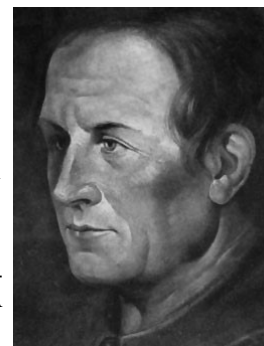
## SAINT OF THE WEEK –

### EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH

*In 2023, we will be highlighting holy men and women from the Americas who are canonized or in the process of canonization. We hope their stories inspire your faith!*

#### Venerable Eusebio Francesco Chini, S.J.

— more commonly known as Father Kino — was born in 1645 in the County of Tyrol, a State of the Holy Roman Empire that is now a territory divided between modern day Italy and Austria. At around 20 years old, in 1665, he joined Society of Jesus and became a Jesuit priest in 1677. He served most of his vocation as a prolific missionary and built missions and ranches extending 50,000 miles though what is now Mexico to present day California and Arizona. A skilled cartographer, Father Kino drew the first accurate maps of the Gulf of California and Baja, California. These maps remained the most accurate maps of this region 150 years after his death until more powerful tools for cartography were invented. Through his travels he encountered 16 different Native tribes and developed relationships with each, often trading European seeds and edible plants as well as cattle, sheep, and goats. In fact, his original herd of twenty cattle that he and his fellow Jesuits transported from Europe to aid in establishing their first missions grew during his lifetime to 70,000 animals as he sold and traded them to the native peoples and settlers. According to historian Herbert Bolton, this won Kino the unofficial title of Arizona's first rancher. Aside from his social work building missions and serving the local peoples he encountered, Father Kino was also a skilled astronomer and mathematician. During his first attempt to travel to New Spain, now the Americas, he unfortunately missed his boat which caused him to have to spend an entire year in southern Spain in the coastal city of Cádiz, before he could reembark. He spent that year observing a comet — later known as Kirch's comet — and published his findings in his astronomical treatise the *Exposición Astronómica de el Cometa*, or in English, the *Astronomical Exhibition of the Comet*. He mentions in this treatise that, with the hope of being a missionary in the Americas, he dedicated his life to Our Lady of Guadalupe as news of the apparition in Mexico a little over 100 years earlier was influencing Spanish culture. After establishing over 25 missions, championing the rights of the native peoples he encountered through his opposition to slavery, and constructing 19 villages to supply cattle and seed to nearby settlements, Father Kino died of a severe fever on March 15, 1711. He is currently honored in the U.S. and Mexico with streets, institutions, and geographic features named for him. He is often depicted in art and sculpture on horseback as that was his main mode of transportation across the American West. Pope Francis advanced the cause of Venerable Eusebio Francesco Chini — Father Kino — on July 11, 2020.

You have blessed Your Church through the life and ministry of Your faithful servant, Fr. Eusebio Francisco Kino, S.J. He has taught and preached well of Your Divine Son, Jesus Christ, and was a true instrument of the Holy Spirit in touching the hearts of countless people through his missionary ministry in the New World. As he joyfully accepted Your divine plans, I ask You, according to Your Will, to hear my prayer for (your intention) offered through the intercession of Fr. Kino through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

If it be according to Your Will, for the honor and glory of the Most Holy Trinity and for the salvation of souls, we ask You to move the Church to proclaim Fr. Kino a saint.

We ask this prayer through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen

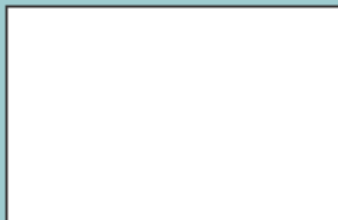
