




Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

All the readings of this Sunday speak about the end of time. In the first reading, Daniel presents the final judgement for humankind, either to a life of condemnation or a life of glorification. *"Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever, others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace"* (Daniel 12:2).

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus declares that the end of the world will come. When it comes, it will bring along chaos, horrors or terrible things. *"In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the noon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heaven will be shaken"* (Mark 13: 24-25).

When will the last day of this world be? This question is not new to all of us! People at all times have been asking this question and have tried to find the answer. Let us take the answer from our Lord: *"But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."* (Mark 13:32)

The statement *"in those days"* presents a reality of light and darkness, beginning and ending, glorification and horror, life and death, and salvation and condemnation. Hearing and believing in this chaotic reality of existence, there is the message of hope and the promise of salvation for those who believe in the Son of God as the Redeemer. Indeed through Jesus' passion, death and resurrection, eternal life was given back to each one of us. Do we want to receive God's gift?

As the liturgical year of our Church is coming to its end, we are reminded that the event 'in those days' will come. As people of faith, after hearing these predictions and images, we are convinced that 'those days' will come. If not for the whole community of humankind in our time, for sure there will be happened for us as individual. Hence, we are called to be ready to welcome the returning of our Lord Jesus Christ!

IT'S IN OUR HANDS

Sunday Spiritual Nourishment
“Why We Do What We Do?”
Part 6

I - Actions speak louder than words!

Remember, the ultimate goal for the Christian is not the immortal soul, but the resurrected body! When a person succeeds in integrating mind, soul, and body into the unity of what the human person is called to be, her or she is, as St. Irenaeus says, "[a human being] fully alive."

II – Gestures: Sign of the Cross, genuflecting, bowing and striking (beating) the breast. Other gestures: incense, *Sanctus* bells, procession, dipping your hand in Holy Water.

III – Postures: During Mass or prayers, we assume different postures—standing, kneeling, and sitting all have profound meaning and are not merely ceremonial. We should understand their meaning and significance to enhance our participation in any kind of prayer.

Standing

Romano Guardini writes in *Sacred Signs*, "When you are sitting down to rest or chat, and someone to whom you owe respect comes in and turns to speak to you, at once you stand up and remain standing so long as he is speaking and you are answering him. Why do we do this? In the first place to stand up means that we are in possession of ourselves. Instead of sitting relaxed and at ease we take hold of ourselves; we stand, as it were, at attention, geared and ready for action. A man on his feet can come or go at once. He can take an order on the instant, or carry out an assignment the moment he is shown what is wanted."

Standing, therefore is another sign of respect or reverence before God. Standing also means that we are ready to respond to Him. As Chiara Lubich, founder of the Focolare Movement said, "*Subito, sempre, e con gioia.*" (Right away, always, and with joy.) When we stand for prayer, we assume our full stature before God, not in pride but in humble gratitude for the marvelous things God has done in creating and redeeming each one of us. Through baptism we have been given a share in the life of God. The posture of standing is an acknowledgment of this wonderful gift. Standing is also significant as:

The normal posture for Jewish prayer and Christian prayer, as is the priest in *orans* position, standing with hands outstretched.

A posture typical of Easter season and a sign of Resurrection.

When you stand at Mass or for any prayer, stand straight and be still because this is a way that we can honor Our Lord! As Psalm 46:10 says: "Be still and know that I am God."


