Here's how it works: Teresa Bronte, HTN's contact at the Willard School, sends us a list with the student's first names, grades, gender, and a brief description of their gift preferences. I share this list with my family, and they each choose the children for whom they'd like to buy gifts. Once purchased, they wrap the

# **Coming Soon: Project Santa 2024**


