Greetings on the 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Our second reading for this Sunday from Thessalonians has this line: õFor our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction.ö When you say these words out loud what image comes to mind? How many people there where, was the speaker standing or sitting, was it a conversation? When you say these words out loud which of the words seem to speak to your heart? Is it õpower and Holy Spiritö or the word õconvictionö? Where does contemplation of those words take your heart and soul?

When you enter the sanctuary you notice the numbers for the Sunday readings are on the music board. This is so we can take the opportunity before Mass to look them over and contemplate Scripture. During Mass we have the õProclamation of the Wordö we are called to *listen closely* and use one of the methods described above to let Scripture enter our beingí Remember the words we say when we sign ourselves with the cross three times before listening to the Gospel. õLord let your word dwell in <u>my mind</u>, be on <u>my lips</u>, and settle in <u>my heartö</u>í

Here is some more trivia that makes you look smart at family events: The sentence: "The quick brown fox jumps over the lazy dog" uses every letter of the alphabet. The winter of 1932 was so cold that Niagara Falls froze completely solid. The words 'racecar,' 'kayak' and 'level' are the same whether they are read left to right or right to left (palindromes). There are 293 ways to make change for a dollar. There are more chickens than people in the world.

In the Pastoral Letter, "Meeting Christ -Living Christ," Bishop Hoeppner talks about the importance of family in prayer. Please arrange your Tuesday evening schedule so you can attend as Bishop Hoeppner discusses the topic: "FAMILIES: The Domestic Church." We will also have available a Book of Blessings that can be used in family settings.

We have one more anointing Mass scheduled this month. It will be on Thursday at 10:30AM at Goldpine. Please bring your family members or friends that can use the healing power of Jesus. When I read the Scripture passage quoted above I thought of the effects I have seen when an anointing takes place. The hand of God touches His people with power and conviction.

This Thursday we also have the NET (National Evangelization Team) retreat for our middle-schoolers. Please keep them in prayer as they witness Jesus come alive in and through the lives of the visiting team members.

We close our Masses this weekend with Benediction: a traditional practice of our faith where we have the opportunity to gaze upon Jesus in the Monstrance. We do this immediately after receiving Jesus in Holy Communion. This is a wonderful time to praise God, and let Him know the intimate thoughts of our heart. We can then leave the church in the knowledge that Christ is before us and in us to strengthen us for life in the world. It is our task to bring Him to others and He wants to be with us on the journey.




# St. Timothy Award
