ALPHA This week the Newman Center kicks back into high gear as students from Bemidji State University and the Northwest Technical College return. As mentioned in November and December, members of the St. Philip & Evangelization Committee are working with students who attend the Newman Center to host a program called õAlpha.ö

Alpha is a practical tool inspiring Catholic renewal and awakening faith in lapsed Catholics, those on the fringe of Church life and those totally outside the Church and/or Christianity. Alpha creates an environment and opportunity for an encounter with Jesus, offering as Pope Francis likes to say, the chance for õJesus to find them.ö It includes a series of evening gatherings where basic issues of faith are discussed like õWho is Jesus?ö õWhy did Jesus die?ö õHow can I have faith?ö õWhy is there evil in the world?ö and so on.


U.S. Catholic bishops are inviting the faithful to participate in 9 Days for Life by taking part in local events and by joining Catholics across the country united in prayer.

SINCE YOU ASKED...

At the recent Family Faith Night held here, there were so many faith questions for Fr. Chuck & Fr. Don, and not enough time to answer them all. All of your questions were worthy of an answer, so they have kept the questions, and will answer them in this column every week:

This weeks questions are answered by Fr. Chuck.

#1) How can Jesus be both God and Man?:

January 2nd is the feast day of Saints Basil and Gregory Nazianzus. These two, along with Basil's brother Gregory, form a trio of important early Christian theologians referred to as the Cappadocian Fathers (they were all from Cappodocia in what is now Turkey). In the days readings we can see the relationship of Jesus to God was something the early Christians had to sort out: was Jesus truly the Sonof God? If he was the Son of God does that mean he was not God himself? How could he be God and Son of God at the same time? The Cappodocian fathers were largely responsible for the church's final answer to these questions: Jesus Christ was both God and Son of God. He shared the essence of what God is (eternal, all knowing, and powerful) but was also his own distinct person as Jesus Christ, the Son of God. This answer was called "the Cappadocian Solution" and became part of the Creed we recite every Sunday. When we say the words "consubstantial with the Father" it means that Jesus shares the essence of God: Jesus is God. When we say "He came down from heaven" it means that Jesus is also his own person, the Son of God distinct from the Father.

#2) Why don't we kneel after receiving Holy Communion?

Posture is important in all of our liturgical celebrations. In the Diocese of Crookston we stand from after the Great Amen until after Jesus has been taken from the church area proper to be placed in the Tabernacle. It is a sign that we are all on this great journey together. We are joined by the meal we shareí the bread and the cupí When we as a family go out for a meal those done first do not leave the table while those who havengt received are left to fend for themselves. We are to be praying for and with each other during the entire distribution of Holy Communion. When the journey is complete then we are invited to enter into private prayer. During this time Father and/or the Deacon will be purifying the vessels. You may kneel or sit during the time of private adoration. We are called to recognize we are sharing one life in the Spirit. Here is another way to say the same thing: BE WHAT YOU SEE AND BECOME WHO YOU ARE MEANT TO BE. THE BODY OF CHRISTÍ VISIBLE IN THE HERE AND NOW.

CHURCHES UNITED NEWS...

Hi, I am Dan Walter, a parishioner here at St Philips since 1974. I speak to you as the representative of St Philips to Churches United.

We are asked as Christians to be aware of our brothers and sisters in need. I ask the question: Who wishes they could reach out to them somehow?

Churches United does that for us in a real way. Churches United was formed in 2002 by the pastors of the downtown Churches and I suspect the Holy Spirit was foundational as other Churches were invited to join so now the number is at twenty seven.

These homeless people would show up at a number of the Churches asking for help. Now they are referred to Churches United in an office at Mt Zion Church; (the old Lincoln School). Churches United gives out many things and in an orderly way such as dishes, soap, blankets, tubs of love, clothing, gasoline, among a number of other things. Also each %dient+ can receive those things a certain number of times per year so accountability is built into this.

Churches United is the last in a number of agencies for helping those in need.

I had said Churches United reaches out to the homeless for us. Each of the members of Churches United contributes to its operation financially. Also, each Church is to have a person at Churches United for one afternoon per month. I am here to ask for a response to their request. Some people work four afternoons per month. Considering the size of St Philipt compared to these other twenty six, might we have a few willing helpers? Hours are Monday through Friday, noon to 4.

The work+involves some data entry, some filing, interviewing of clients, and sorting the inventory.

During the hours I spent at Churches United, two people came in. After they left I commented % were surely polite.+ The workers there said they were very typical.

Sometimes at the end of the liturgy we'ge charged to %ake Jesus out into the world.+ This is one way to do this.
