Sunday, April 5, 2015

Alleluia! We celebrate salvation by our God. We started our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday with a desire to get closer to Jesus. DAA update:

This update is as of March 31st.

Thank you to the 329 parishioners of St. Philip ϕ , which is 24.67% of our registered parishioners, who have responded to the appeal. St Philip's goal is \$74,813.00 with \$59,139.00 pledged. We need to raise an additional \$15,674.00 to meet our goal.

The new numbers for St. Charles are: a goal of \$2,184.00 pledges of \$330.00 by 4 parishioners which is 15% of the goal. There is a remaining amount of \$1,854.00 needed to meet their goal.

There will be a mailing from the Diocese to all parish families that have not had the opportunity to respond to previous requests. We will continue to offer updates and reminders of the importance of the DAA. Extra contribution envelopes are available on the bulletin boards. Among those who receive the benefit of your generous donations are Seminarians, couples filling for a Decree of Nullity, Schools, and Faith Formation programs, and the general expenses for a Bishop such as travel throughout the year. Your donation helps the greater church as it spreads the good news of Jesus.

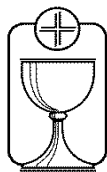
Family Faith Night
