Almost every significant theological discussion in Church history resolved itself through a better understanding of two very opposite theological ideas. For example, in the early centuries of the Church there was one theological facet stating that Jesus was õwholly Manö and another facet convinced Jesus was õwholly God.ö The churchøs resolution became the doctrine of Christ as we understand it today; Jesus is both completely divine and completely human. Although this paradoxical doctrine creates more questions than answers, and leaves a lot to the mystery of Godøs providence and our imagination (*What does it mean to be both God AND Man?*), the solution also provides the most complete response to Jesusøtrue nature.

The õboth, andö principle becomes the cornerstone to understanding more deeply how we pray in the liturgy every Sunday. Vatican II called our Eucharistic Liturgy the õsource and summitö of our faith where õThe other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward itö (SC 47, LG 11). Therefore Mass on Sunday becomes the most important thing we do in our Catholic life to both stay connected to God, and to each other as a community. The liturgy is both the individual means for our body and soul to unite to God, and the communal connection that we have to each other as the family of God coming to the Eucharistic table. Imagine how the story of the Last Supper would change if there had been only John and Jesus, or Peter and Jesus. Gathering in community becomes a critical foundation to praying the Eucharist since the very beginning.

When my uncle passed away a few weeks ago, I was struck by a really beautiful bond that my cousins and uncles created and maintained through their annual deer hunting weekends. The pictures at his funeral showed deer antlers, card games, and happy campers in a mouse infested shack in the woods. It was this regular communal activity and routine of gathering that kept these otherwise busy and unconnected family members connected in a very special and unique way. When my uncle passed away, they shared stories and memories of my uncle that really strengthened their own connection and helped them to grieve. They were really connected in a way that would have not been there if they had not been a part of this special deer camp community.

Sometimes praying with others at Mass can be hard and annoying. The person next to you smells, a baby is crying, the church is too warm, and you may not like the music. Being in community is hard, you have disagreements, some people are just weird, and you may not feel a strong connection to these people in other aspects of your life, and now you have to be with them every Sunday?

Furthermore, many people feel that they genuinely pray better alone, in their room, out in nature, or fishing on one of our beautiful lakes. And I think this is wonderful. Our vocation in the world is to pray always, and the Church encourages private devotional prayer so that everyone can find their way to connect to God, even if that means you find that you can pray a lot more when the Vikings play on Sunday.

Yet, the Mass is BOTH a communal AND individual event. The Mass calls us to communion with God, and with each other, bringing us out of ourselves into deeper conversion. St. Thomas Aquinas called the Eucharist the õsacrament of unity,ö because though we are many individuals the Body of Christ unites us into community. õSo we, who are many, are one body in Christ.ö Romans 12:5


