õIf anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all.ö

I am a widower. My spouse, Valerie, died 15 years ago. Today, I want to take you back a few years in time to when we were raising our seven children. As most parents we encouraged them to be good students. We wanted them involved in sports, plays and other activities. When they came home with good grades or positive comments we joined in the praise. When they played sports even though we didnot stress the need to win every time; when they won we celebrated a little more than when they lost. After all the top performers get the most recognition.

In the family we stressed to our children that it is important to have a good education so they can get a good job and can afford to buy the best for their families. Television and movies tell us it is good to be beautiful, rich, and strong. We admire clever people. We want to have our name known by

In the work place many companies have incentive plans to reward achieving top honors. The work team with the best production pace receives lunch on the company tomorrow. The salesman who brings in the most new customers this month is recognized. The saleswoman who increases current customer sales by the highest percentage is recognized. At home, school or work in our American society we treasure being in a position of esteem or honor.

Now let go back to the time of Jesus. What were the twelve arguing about that would cause Jesus to tell his disciples? õIf anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all.ö They were arguing about who was the best and should get the highest honor. The arguing of the twelve can be summed up in two words, Jealousy and Ambition. Jealousy and Ambition are the extreme for a culture that places a high value on being rich, beautiful, strong, clever, and being on top or in the place of honor. If we look closely at ourselves we realize there are times we are jealous of others and ambitious in our plans.

Jesus turned the values of the world upside down when he said; olf anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all. Ö Jesus was saying he wanted us to be gentle, merciful, faithful, and sincere. He told us we need to take the last place and be a servant to all.

The gospel from this Sunday has a lot to do with our daily lives. It does not mean that when we push ourselves or family members or friends to be the best it is wrong. But if we want to be first in Godøs eyes we must be willing to go against what we learn from our human standards. To give up our human standards is the problem. To bring balance to our lives and avoid the extreme is the problem.

We need to consider giving up some activities that take up our time and energy for ourselves and instead help someone in need. For example: how about you and your family helping serve a meal at a shelter. Fall is coming, what if you or your family took the time to rake an elderly neighborgs yard, or together with others cleaned up an empty lot in the neighborhood. Could you maybe watch the children of a single parent so they have some time to shop or relax?

In the work place is it possible to shock our coworkers or boss and suggest that as a group we sponsor a neighborhood playground, or spend some time together helping at the Clothing Depot or Food Shelf, is it possible the company could put some money in an award recipients name as a scholarship to an employee@s child in school? Your imagination and ability to reach out sets the limit of good we can do for another person.

Jesus is not asking usí he is telling usí to place the other person in front of us. We take the last or least position. If we do, then in Godøs eyes we will be first. Are we up to the challenge?




