Is Jesus the King of your life? Not just for a couple of hours on Saturday evening or Sunday morning each week, but twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.





SCHOOL UPDATE: ANTHONY KERR, SCHOOL PRINCIPAL, ST. MARY'S MISSON

Tony, how many students are enrolled at St. Mary's Mission School? Mary's this year.

Last year we talked about improving reading scores; how have scores changed this past year?

We are seeing a 35% increase in reading achievement at grade level or higher. Eighty-five percent of our kindergarten - 2nd graders are reading at or above grade level, and 100% of our 3-6th graders are reading at or above grade level, as measured by the Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA).

Do you have a particular focus for this school year?

We'll be focusing harder on math this year with cross-curricular teach-

ing and common math language in gaged. Our classrooms and lesson stathe classrooms. There are many team There are 94 students enrolled at St. teaching opportunities to reach learners at every level.

> What do you think has made the biggest impact on these scores?

> Intervention specialist Jackie Crisman not only works with the kids regularly in small groups, but is working with the teachers on providing richer learning experiences in reading for the kids. That support has really allowed us to broaden our focus on learning, and it's allowed the students to succeed. We also utilize an approach we call "ILP," or "Individual Learning Plans." ILP focuses on the fact that each child learns differently. We develop relationships with and learn about each individual child so that he or she will be more en

tions and different activities used for the lessons are all set up specifically for that purpose. It's our job to figure out, "How am I going to help this child learn, and what evidence am I going to use to show that he or she is really learning?" Part of the success in using the ILP model is because we have smaller class sizes. We have the time and ability to get to know each child and his learning style and needs, and we can do it quickly.

Tell us how you see the identity and uniqueness of St. Mary's School.

The identity is beyond something tangible. It's more of a feeling created in the school of warmth and love and compassion, deeper than community. It's family. Many of our parents were

students here also, and that is a big part of the parental support we have: the parents are not only concerned with what we are teaching their kids but that we know and love their kids.

How do you express that care and love for each child? By teaching not only education but witnessing God's love to the kids every day, there innately comes a socio-emotional component of support. Whether that is an unintend-

ed consequence or blessing of what we do here, it's very important and I think that whether the students get this at home or they don't, they know they are going to get it here. There's a connection between the students and teachers and staff. It's valued and I think it's very appreciated.

Fr. Jerry always says when the students see us (the staff) being kind to one another and treating each other respectfully, that is where the true teaching of God's love takes place. If the kids are seeing it every day, throughout the day, that's where their true learning comes from.

Do you think attending St. Mary's Mission School makes a long-term impact on the students?

Yes, for sure. The kids know what they have here is very special. The kids that matriculate out of St. Mary's and go into junior high in public school are leaders in their new school. So we know we have made an an impact on them.

"IT'S ALL ABOUT THE KIDS!" FR. JERRY ROGERS, PASTOR, ST. MARY'S MISSION

At St. Mary's Mission School, our primary mission is to surround our students with the strength of our faith, the power of our prayer and the living witness of our shared beliefs and values. What does this look like?


It is the school principal and teachers telling the kids daily, "You are capable of achieving your greatest dreams!" so they will learn to rely on their own inner strength instead of walking with others on a dangerous path. It is listening to the kids respectfully so they understand they do not have to suffer in silence but can speak up and share what hurts. It is reminding them that they are made in God's image and likeness so they can see the value in their own lives and those of their peers. It is celebrating their amazing Anishinaabe heritage and culture so they can stand tall in the face of ignorance and prejudice.

And it is a young boy named Steven, newly enrolled in pre-school this year, who struggled from the very beginning. Once, his mother even had to be called to come and take him home for the day. Yet recently, his teacher felt a tug on her slacks while she was getting the kids ready to go home at the end of the day. She looked down, and there was Steven, looking up at her. He asked, "Will you hug me?" She did. When I stopped in for a classroom visit a few days later, Steven was sitting in the teacher's rocker with his classmates sitting on the floor in front of him as he told them a story.

Breakthroughs like these are celebrated every bit as much at St. Mary's Mission School as are the striking improvements in reading scores or the fact that religion is now taught to every grade by the wonderful Sr. Kathleen. What sharing our faith, prayer and values looks like on a day to day basis is love.

Allow me to echo our Bishop's gratitude for all you do to help make St. Mary's Mission School possible.
