First, I know I speak for Fr. Chuck as well when I say "thank you" to all who have remembered us with cards and gifts during these holy days. May God richly bless you and your families!

As the first semester of the school year at BSU comes to a close (last Mass is this weekend), I want to thank all those who continue to support the ministry of the Newman Center in so many ways. From financial gifts to the preparation and serving of a meal to the students every Thursday night your sacrifices of time, talent and treasure are greatly appreciated. I want to remind parishioners of St. Philip's who have come to Newman Masses that the liturgies there geared to the students and will focus even more so in the new semester. Just a heads up for those with children high school age and lower, some explicit topics will be discussed...such is the purpose of the ministry at Newman.

Over Christmas break we will welcome to our doors some of the homeless in our community through the annual Servants of Shelter (SOS) program. Churches in the community join together to provide food and shelter overnight during the winter months.

Because of our school we are unable to host SOS at any other time but over Christmas. Thank you to Kay Mack and her crew of volunteers who help bring warmth, food and a dose of hope into the lives of our homeless brothers and sisters.

Please call the parish office (444-4262) if you are aware of folks who are homebound and would appreciate a visit. Several parishioners have, through our time and talent survey, have volunteered to be regular visitors to those who cannot get to Mass. We will do our best to match volunteers with the right folks so no one is left out of our faith life as a parish.

Don't forget the parish reconciliation service on Monday, December 14th at 6:30pm when priests from the area will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Christ has blessed us with the beauty of this Sacrament. Come home, the door is open!

Saturday, December 19th from 10-11am we will gather as we do each month for prayer at Planned Parenthood. What a great witness to our faith and to our belief in the dignity of every human life. The reactions of some driving by may not be very polite but we still stand in witness to the love of God as shown through the lives of the most innocent among us, the child in the womb. 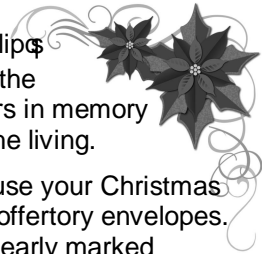

Servants of Shelter **~ Opportunity to Volunteer ~**

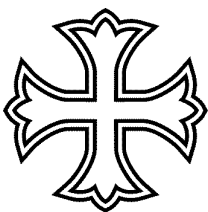
In response to homelessness in Bemidji, Servants of Shelter was formed by several churches in Bemidji to provide safe nighttime shelter to the homeless, as well as three meals a day. Each week, the shelter moves from church to church and can host up to 20 homeless people at a time. All of the guests go through a background clearance so that volunteers and guests can be given the best assurance of personal safety.

Each year for many years, St. Philips has served as a host to the Servants of Shelter program during the week of Christmas. We work around the school calendar so that we can host while St. Philips School is not in session. This year, we have an opportunity to host for more than the traditional one week and will serve the needs of the homeless **from Sunday, December 20 through the morning of Wednesday, December 30th**. On Christmas Eve and Christmas day we find alternate accommodations for the guests as we need our entire facility to serve the huge Christmas Mass crowds.

Guests arrive at 4:00 each afternoon and leave at 8:30 in the morning. We schedule our volunteers for **four hour shifts**, and have two volunteers on each shift. That means that we need no less than 8 volunteers each day of the shelter, plus people to provide meals. We are proud to say that we have a long list of parishioners that have filled shifts over the years, and we consistently receive a yes when we call them to work each year. However, we always need a new group of volunteers to cover this great ministry.

If you are willing/able to volunteer, please contact Kay at 556 -3031 or Paula at 368-1081. We will do everything we can to find a shift that works well for you. We will also have sign-up sheets after Mass on the weekend of December 12-13.

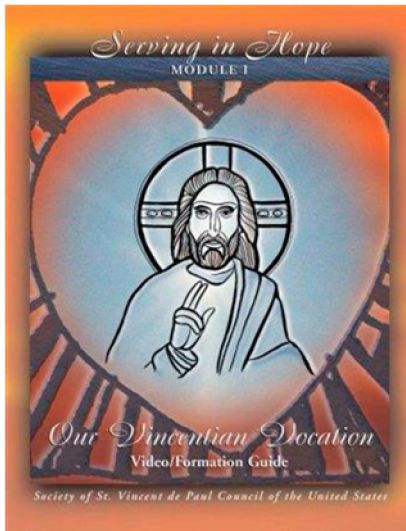

SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

ST. PHILIP'S CONFERENCE



The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is an international organization of lay persons who seek, in a spirit of justice and charity and by person-to-person involvement, to help those who are suffering. St. Philip's officially started a St. Vincent de Paul conference this fall and is seeking more members. Currently we are working our way through the Serving in Hope series provided by the National Council of the United States Society of St. Vincent de Paul. To provide this personal and neighborly help, Vincentians organize themselves into small working groups, known as "Conferences," which are the first line of action.

For years St. Philip's Parish has had a St. Vincent de Paul fund, which acted as our parish's form of tithing to share the gifts our parish has received and to support other charities. This fund, which was formerly called the St. Vincent de Paul fund, is now called our Social Concerns Fund and has a Social Concerns Committee to oversee the disbursement of these gifts. The reason for the name change is so that it would not be

confused with our newly formed conference, which is part of the national St. Vincent de Paul organization. The Vincentian goal is to grow in spirituality, fellowship, and to serve others.

We have so many wonderful organizations in our area to help others that you may be wondering why start another. We don't intend to duplicate services; rather we want to supplement the existing services by coming alongside those in need. We will provide the ears to listen to our brothers' and sisters' struggles, be the shoulder to cry on, or support those going through a rough time. We will follow the apostolic practice of going two-by-two into our neighbors' home to meet them where they are and help them through their difficulties. After listening to their concerns, our help may include sharing information about available services, helping navigate the paperwork and red tape, encouraging and nudging them along to overcome the obstacles they face. Our intent is not to provide all of the assistance that may be needed, but rather to provide a portion and encourage them to do their part so as not to enable but rather to empower. For those that want to change their circumstances, we will be a mentor and provide the guidance needed to embark on that journey together.

Would you like to join or support us? The load is lighter when shared by many. As Vincentians, we are learning about the Vincentian Rule, the poverty that exists in our community, as well as the resources available in our area. We will be receiving training early next year on how to conduct home visits and the Bridges Out of Poverty program to change how we view poverty and how we can help others out of poverty. We are prayerfully asking for God's help to grow us spiritually and for your help in serving others. Our conference meets twice a month on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month. We welcome you to join as a full member and attend regular meetings and grow with us. If you are unable to regularly attend meetings and help, you are still welcome to serve with us in any way you can, whether it is to help financially or by donating materials, being available on call for projects, or doing home visits occasionally to name just a few examples. Please call the parish office to leave your name and contact information with Tammy and someone from our conference will get back to you or you may stop by and visit with me in the social hall after mass. Thank you for your time and opening your hearts to serve others. May God bless your generosity and willing heart!

The State of Poverty

Poverty in the U.S.

- According to the U.S. Census Bureau, there are currently about 46.7 million people living in poverty in the U.S.
- There are currently two basic poverty problems in the U.S.
 - One is the prevalence of low-wage work
 - The other concerns those who have almost no work
- Half of the jobs in the country now pay less than \$33,000 a year
 - A quarter pay less than the poverty line of \$22,000 for a family of four
- Here in the U.S. nearly 50 million people are living in poverty... that is one out of every seven Americans
 - One out of every five children lives in poverty
- The states with the highest poverty rates are Mississippi, New Mexico and Louisiana
- 25.4 percent of people with annual incomes less than \$25,000 were uninsured in 2011 compared to 7.8 percent of people with annual incomes of \$75,000 or more
 - The total number of uninsured persons was 48.6 million in 2011

How the Society of St. Vincent de Paul helps

One of the largest charitable organizations in the world, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (www.svdpusa.org) is an international, nonprofit, Catholic lay organization of about 800,000 men and women who voluntarily join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to the needy and suffering in 150 countries on five continents. With the U.S. headquarters in St. Louis, Mo., membership in the United States totals more than 160,000 in 4,400 communities.

SVdP offers a variety of programs and services, including home visits, housing assistance, disaster relief, education and mentoring, food pantries, dining halls, clothing, assistance with transportation, prescription medication, and rent and utility costs. The Society also works to provide care for the sick, the incarcerated and the elderly. In 2014, SVdP provided nearly \$1 billion in tangible and in-kind services to those in need, made more than two million personal visits (homes, hospitals, prisons and eldercare facilities) and helped more than 14.1 million people regardless of race, religion or national origin.
