January 31, 2016

When I was little, visiting the Church where my grandparents lived, my mom would always make a point to show me the rocks on the building that came from the family farm. When the church was built, the families were asked to give what they could to help, and as many of you probably know, every farm has plenty of rocks. Every time I attend this Church, I am always so honored that my Grandpa helped build the Church. He probably didnøt realize that he would give me encouragement in my faith even though he died before I was born. Iøm sure he was just happy to get rid of the rocks. Yet, he participated and perpetuated the tradition of faith and inspired my own relationship with the Church through his generous gesture.

The Liturgyøs blueprint is tradition. It is an evolving development of traditions that has morphed and transformed over centuries and simultaneously held on to its very core since the time Jesus instituted the Eucharist, õThis is my body, this is my blood.ö

Tradition can get a bad taste in your mouth at times. It means something too structured, archaic, and lacking spontaneity. I can even feel like this really isnot my prayer, as it is passed on from someone before me. It can feel disingenuous. Yet the Church firmly professes that the tradition of prayer in the Church, like the liturgy, is how the Holy Spirit teaches us to pray. õThrough a living transmission (Sacred Tradition) within the believing and praying Church the Holy Spirit teaches the children of God how to pray.ö (CCC 2650)

We can never abandon the wisdom of those who have gone before. We proudly continue our traditions, like liturgy, as they represent those that have gone before us, and who are now praying with us in heaven. The early 20th century Catholic author G.K Chesterton writes õTradition means giving a vote to most obscure of all classes, our ancestors. Tradition is the democracy of the dead.ö The tradition of praying our liturgy, as the Church has passed on to us gives us the opportunity to connect beyond our personal experience.

Practically, the tradition of the liturgy helps with my prayer during the Mass. The routine is actually prayerful because each time I pray the Mass I can peel another layer away of the onion. I know what to expect, so I do not have to worry about what is coming next. Everyone can participate along with the actions, and pray with each other in common songs, dialogues, and prayers. This communal aspect helps anyone new to pray along with ease, after just a few weeks of attending Mass. I can even go to another country and pray the Mass with people from a different culture, I may not understand the language, but I definitely know the liturgy. The liturgy unites all people, from all backgrounds in the action of Christøs sacrifice.

The Church always encourages diversity and styles of prayer, as it recognizes the diversity of her people. However, celebrating Eucharist on Sunday is always pride of place. It is here that we pray with all those of the past who have participated in this tradition before us and with all those in the pews today. As baptized people we participate and bring ourselves to the table, bringing our stream to add to the river of tradition. Just as Grandpa gave some rocks from his farm adding to the beautiful structure of the Church, we bring ourselves to the sacrifice at the altar. As Lent begins in a few weeks, it is not a bad time to take a minute to think about what you are bringing to build up the Church. Do you have a spare rock in your garden to add to the tradition?


