February 7, 2016

Work, Work, Work; the Pastoral, School, and Finance Councils, and the Long Range Planning Committees of Programs and Facilities are hard at work, discussing and responding to the comments made by you, the parishioners, at the fall parish meetings. We are looking at how we can become a better community empowered by the message of the Gospel.

The top priority coming out of our parish planning meetings was to provide a fair wage for teachers and staff that could be maintained in the years to come. After working with the Parish, Finance and School Councils, weave come up with a plan to bring all wages to a level of 85% of the public school salaries over the next three school years. The plan provides for assistance with continuing education and rewards longevity. As a parish committed to good stewardship, this is not only achievable but maintainable over the foreseeable future.

At the same time, as a parish we continue to address the on-going maintenance and upgrade needs of our buildings, grounds and equipment. For example, in 2015 we were able to upgrade our telephone system, our wireless internet system, and our church sound equipment. There is improved handicap access at both sides of our Narthex and also our Parish Office. We were also able to implement necessary changes to our school and parish security through a new system of locks and door-access-cards. Security and safety of our children along with parishioners and staff, continues to be a top priority.

Every year brings continued maintenance to our existing facilities, and 2016 is no exception. For example, the roof on our school has reached the end of its useful life. The past few years we we been able to extend this life by patching. However, the possibility of leaks that would lead to major damage to the school interior is growing. It is time to install a new 20-year roof. The Pastoral Council felt it would be beneficial to establish a group to review our campus to set a calendar timeline for other major cost repairs we can expect as our campus ages.

We recognize also our need to bring on board, at the right time, experts such as architects and engineers, to advise us by drafting comprehensive specifications for the work necessary such as specs to reroof the school before we proceed. Our desired outcome is to ensure a fair bidding-process that will result in the lowest possible price.

As we prepare the list of other repair, replacement, and maintenance needs on our future calendar, the Council asked that we change up how we prepare for major expenses like roof replacement along with air conditioning R-22 Freon replacement that may cost in excess of \$190,000.00. The Council provided direction to establish an escrow fund to be available when it becomes time to fulfill those future needs. The wisdom of Dick Rude in granting a gift of maintenance dollars to the parish through his will is an example of how the parish can have some funds available before the need arises. Dick provided a gift of \$50,000.00 to be used as current needs arise and an additional gift of \$50,000.00 with the principal restricted and only interest earned to be used for future maintenance.

Whenever we approach major cost projects we will continue to keep parish members informed. We also have a duty to keep Bishop Hoeppner and the Diocesan Building and Maintenance Committee informed as well.

We are a parish that is growing and spreading the Word of God. The work of parishioners on the various committees is resulting in suggestions that will bear much fruit. Let us offer thanks to God that He has given us the resources of time, talent, and treasure to help us bring the Gospel message alive in our homes, our parish community, our neighborhoods, our work and other environments.

Jesus, we trust in you! Jesus loves you and so do I, Fr Chuck



Year of Mercy Hymn

During this season of Lent, we will have a very cool opportunity to learn a new song that was commissioned solely for the Year of Mercy. When Pope Francis declared a Year of Mercy, he desired the entire world celebrate, not just Rome. For this purpose the Vatican commissioned a piece of music to be sung in every diocese and parish. Paul Inwood, an American composer (Center of My Life), was chosen to write the hymn. Pope Francis gave the text to be used; "Misericordes Sicut Pater" (Be merciful like the Father). The refrain is in Latin so as to have a common language connecting all the Catholics throughout the world singing in one voice, and the verses are in the local language of the parish. Inwood intended the song to sound like the contemplative meditations of Taize (Jesus, Remember Me). We will begin this new song in Lent, incorporating only the refrain while we transfer the Eucharist from the altar to the tabernacle after communion. May you have a Blessed Year of Mercy!



School of Prayer: Learn To Fall In Love With Christ Through Prayer

Each year the Church, in her wisdom, offers us Lent, a 40-day period of meditation, prayer, and spiritual renewal. It can be a joyful time for growth and conversion.

We hear on Ash Wednesday Jesus calling us to pray, to fast, and to give alms: when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites,+when you fast, do not look gloomy,+when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right is doing+(Mt 6:5, 16, 3).

Our Lords threefold call to pray, to fast, and to give alms is richly interconnected. In prayer the Holy Spirit, always active in our lives, shows us those areas where we are not free . areas that call for penance . as well as those people who are in need of our care. Through fasting, our spirit becomes more open to hearing Gods call, and we receive new energies for performing works of charity. Almsgiving puts us in contact with the needy whom we then bring back to God in prayer.

These three disciplines of Lent are directed toward the nurturing of relationships. Ultimately, the end goal of our Lenten practices is a stronger, more vibrant relationship with God, our neighbors, and ourselves.

Before we start our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday, let us take some time to understand where we are in our faith lives and where we would like to go during the season.

St. Philips Church is providing a variety of opportunities to assist you with your prayer, fasting, and almsgiving this Lent. It is not necessary to do everything that is available. Gods grace begins to work in small steps.

Guidelines for Abstinence and Fasting

By refraining from eating, we signify our oneness with the Lord, acknowledge our need for conversion, and give witness to our solidarity with those less fortunate.

Abstinence

Is a penitential practice consisting of refraining from the consumption of meat and is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence.

Pastors and parents are encouraged to see that children who are not bound by the obligation to fast and abstain are led to appreciate an authentic sense of penance.

Fasting and Abstinence

In addition to abstinence, fasting is to be observed by all Catholics between the ages of 18-59 years. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to ones needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting.

If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.
