It has stories of God's mercy and love in a world that sometimes forgets to forgive and have mercy for others.

Alleluia! Today is *Divine Mercy Sunday*. See you at the celebration at 3PM on Sunday. It is a good time to get a plenary indulgence.

Alleluia! Here is a great story from an article on *ōJewish Wisdom for the Catholic Soulō*: It is a Jewish comment on the power of love. Profound love of another person has a deep, transforming impact upon the receiver. This truth is revealed in an incident witnessed by writer Yitta Halberstam Mandelbaum who tells of accompanying a rabbi to a prison in upstate New York. The rabbi, Shlomo Carlebach, was invited by the Jewish chaplain to perform a Hanukkah concert for Jewish inmates. Although there were only 8 Jewish prisoners, no payment was involved, and the prison was eight hours away, the rabbi accepted the invitation without a moment's hesitation. "No problem" was his cheerful and immediate response.

The concert was a huge success and when it was over, the rabbi turned to the chaplain saying: "Please, I would like to visit with the rest of the inmates here. Could you get permission?" Rabbi Shlomo went into every cell where he embraced, hugged and talked with each inmate. He did the same with prisoners he encountered in the recreation room, the kitchen, and every other possible nook and cranny of the prison where he was permitted to go.

As he was departing, a big, burly inmate with a scarred, pitted face ran to him shouting: "Rabbi, Rabbi. Please wait." Rabbi Shlomo stopped and affectionately said: "Yes, my holy friend?"

The inmate began to shift in embarrassment as if he regretted his impulsive act and then asked: "I just loved that hug you gave me before! Would you mind giving me another one?" Smiling and beaming with joy at the inmate, Rabbi Shlomo enfolded him in his arms and they stood clasped together for several moments. Finally, the inmate broke away and said: "Rabbi, no one, no one, ever hugged me like that before." With tears flowing down his scarred, pitted face, the inmate added: "If only someone had hugged me like that 10 years ago, I surely wouldn't be here in this prison today."

Alleluia! When a child is asked what the important thing about Easter is and they reply quickly Jesus rose from the dead, it makes me feel gratitude for the parents who are taking time to speak with their children about eternal life. Thank You for speaking with the eyes of faith.

Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! I love saying the word Alleluia!

Jesus loves you and so do I. Fr. Chuck

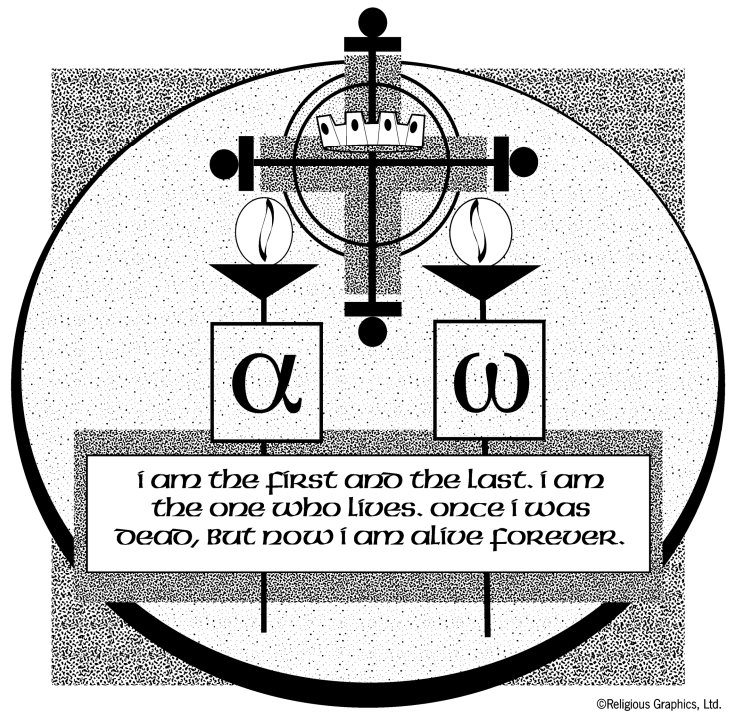

St Philip's Parish has an opening for a Finance Council representative.

The Finance Council serves as a consultative body for the Pastor through which the Christian faithful are to "aid the pastor in the administration of parish goods". Administration of parish goods means: the implementation of a responsible stewardship program, long-range financial planning, the preparation and monitoring of an overall parish budget, the preparation of an annual financial report for publication in the parish bulletin, and the establishment of norms to insure that the funds of parish guilds, clubs, etc., serve the broader financial needs of the parish. You would be participating in the discussions providing direction for the parish. The Finance Council meets on the 2nd Wednesday of each month (except July) at noon. Terms are normally 3 years with an option for a second 3 year term. After 6 years on the council the individual must take a 1 year break before seeking to rejoin the council. We are grateful to Shannon Schmitt who will have completed a slightly longer than 6 year term as of this June 30th. Please let any council member or Fr. Chuck know of your interest in serving the parish.

Mother Teresa: A Woman of Compassion

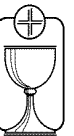

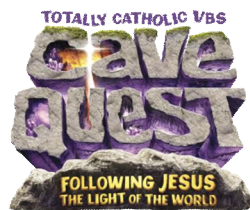

"Consoling the Heart of Jesus – Group Study" This program can be used as a retreat or regular group study and includes 10 talks by Fr. Michael Gaitley who is author of the book. Through the program, participants come to know Christ in the Divine Mercy in a deeper way through walking through the rules of St. Ignatius.

"Mercy: A Bible Study Guide for Catholics" By Fr. Mitch Pacwa S.J. Each of the six sessions of this book will help us rediscover the incredible history of God's mercy in our own lives, which in turn will lead us to an understanding of the importance of extending God's love and mercy to the world around us.

"Wisdom and Works of Mercy – Group Study" Authored by Fr. Michael Gaitley, this program, which can be used as a retreat or as a 10 session setup will bring participants into a deeper knowledge of their faith through talks and study of the book "The One Thing is Three".

A Benedictine Approach to Spirituality: Wisdom Deepened by Interfaith Dialogue



Becky Van Ness, M.A.

Benedictine spirituality centers on a set of core values. We find parallels to these Benedictine values in faiths such as Buddhism. Van Ness explores how insights from our traditions can deepen our spiritual maturation as Christians. The Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue in Rome recognizes the value of collaboration between faiths. Monastic Interreligious Dialogue works under this council to promote dialogue between various monastic communities, especially Benedictine and Buddhist.

Becky Van Ness is an adjunct faculty at Saint John's University where she serves as the Director of the Spiritual Direction Program and is an oblate of Saint Benedict's monastery. Van Ness earned a Master of Arts degree in Christian Spirituality and the Graduate Certificate in Spiritual Direction and directed retreats at Creighton University. She promotes and participates in Monastic Interreligious Dialogue, which operates under the aegis of the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue in Rome.
