Jesus said to his disciples:  $\tilde{o}$ I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you.ö

As I thought about this verse from the Gospel of John, I reflected on the movement of the Holy Spirit in and through the parishes of St Philips, the Holy Spirit Newman Center and St Charles. The Spirit of God is evident in the excitement on faith formation nights, as a staff we have been impressed by the number of participants in our recent adult faith formation talks, the women who help prepare the prayer blankets that are used in hospital and homebound ministry, the people who are stopping by for a regular or quick visit with Jesus, the usage of materials from the CD, Magazine, and DVD rack items, the number of anointings before surgery, the number who attend mass on a weekday, comments from confirmation students during their interviews, and the number of folks who are willing to share moments close to Jesus with one another.

I cannot list all of the examples of parishioners being of service to one anotherí those parents and students who serve as small group leaders and classroom leaders, those who cook for the students at the Newman, those who prepare St Charles for its summer activities. It is humbling; Thank You Jesus for the gift of your Spirit in and among your people.

Let us pray that we have a safe and enjoyable summer season with favorable weather. For those who will be traveling please remember to check with www.masstimes.org to arrange for your weekend commitment to celebrate the Eucharistic banquet (Mass) wherever your travels take you. Be sure and ask for dispensation if you are in an area where Mass is not available. Remember you can get dispensation in advance. After the fact it is called reconciliation.

May is the month of Mary. I invite you to consider saying a rosary once a week as a family. Mary is a powerful intercessor. We have rosaries and instruction cards in the Blessed Sacrament chapel. The rosary is offered between masses on Sunday in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. A group of dedicated individuals also say the rosary following the Wednesday school Mass with the intention of the school and its students. If you are not sure how to say a rosary stop by, watch and learn how to say a rosary by participating in the prayer.

We may need a parish meeting to discuss the upcoming roof repairs and maintenance items to be completed over the summer. We have been gifted by previous generations with a great physical campus and a thriving ministry of service to others. We are a parish that strives to live the Gospel message. At the parish meeting I plan to discuss the topic of stewardship. As a quick reminder: Stewardship is not a program. Stewardship is more than the Sunday offertory. Stewardship is more than Time, Talent and Treasure. Stewardship is a spiritual lifestyle based in Scripture which holds that all we are and all we have flow from Godos grace. Stewardship is the grateful response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives Godøs gifts and shares these gifts in love of God and neighbor. A good steward serves a caretaker of spiritual and worldly blessings.






