This Sunday we have a theme of <code>oprayer.opsic</code> In the Gospel Jesus teaches us to pray, and in the first reading from Genesis Abraham shows prayer in action as he talks with God about the number of faithful in Sodom and Gomorra. Abraham through prayer (conversation with God) moves God to saying he will not destroy the city if 10 faithful are found. In our parish we have many people faithful to prayer. Sometimes it is easy to see how God answers prayer and other times we wonder why God hasnot answered our prayer.

In a conversation with a young man he told me he did not pray as a daily or normal practice. He has responded to a challenge to pray every day for his family, especially for his fiancé. Will he see his prayers answered? Will he continue the practice of prayer if he does not? It is the same question for all of us.

It is important for all who pray that we do not limit God in our prayers. God cannot change someone heart. Really, He can: He is God, but out of love He will not impose a change on someone. He has given us the gift of free will to accept or reject as we choose. God will not violate the gift of free will. He can provide the grace for softening and changing hearts but it is up to the individual to accept it.

There are examples of remarkable response to prayer. Recently a gentleman was dying but struggling. The family called for a priest. We prayed togetherí there was calm, and soon the man passed peacefully into the arms of Jesus. I talked with a nurse who sat by a patient bed and said a rosary with a family member who was not Catholic but wanted to prayí their loved one was able to relax with the prayer and left this world.

We are called to be in communication with God. Frequently is best. We also need to remember <u>it</u> <u>is not always the ritual and exactly how it is done that is important,</u> but that our hearts are turned toward Him and we are seeking God.

Recently Cardinal Sarah (the Vatican Official for Liturgy) made the news by issuing an invitation for priests, by Advent, to face the East during the Eucharistic Prayer or in churches such as ours (with a north/south orientation) to have the priest with his back to the people during the Eucharistic Prayer. The conversation was open, quick, and very busy with quotes from several Bishops who weighed in with their thoughts. There are some in the church who would like to see a more traditional (Latin) Mass structure and there are those who want to continue with our current arrangement.

Pope Francis is a leader who likes to be open and to dialogue. In a visit with Cardinal Sarah they were in dialogue about the Mass but, as can happen in our society, some of the comments were taken out of context. Instantly there was a media frenzy over possible changes. The Vatican issued a follow-up statement that there were no changes imminent. As Catholics we trust in God and follow the lead of the successors of the Apostles (our Bishops). For us in the Crookston Diocese we are obedient to the teachings as presented to us by Bishop Hoeppner. If and when there are any liturgical changes in the Diocese of Crookston it would come from his office and we as faithful Catholics would observe them closely.

Last Sunday, I was nervous when talking from the pulpit about money. I asked for a prayerful increase in donations by everyone by 20% to cover the roof/AC project and to cover future maintenance needs. I asked those currently not gifting to the parish to consider giving on a regular basis. We do have a vibrant, healthy, growing parish community. Your gifts of time, talent and treasure are important in allowing us õto accomplish Godøs workö.



ST. LEOPOLD MANDIC

DATES: 5/12/1866 - 7/30/1942

FEAST DAY: JULY 30

BEARER OF MERCY'S BURDEN

"For nearly 30 years," this frail and sickly Capuchin priest from Padua, "would spend between 10-15 hours a day...in his confessional listening to and forgiving sinners in the name of God. Due to his small stature and humble attitude, some people undervalued him, including his own Capuchin brothers. They said of him, "he was an ignorant confessor, too lenient, and he absolved everyone without discernment." Some even contemptuously called him: 'Brother-absolve-everybody.' But he was sought after more than anyone else.

He always apologized humbly: 'They say I'm too good. But if people come and kneed in front of me, is this not sufficient proof that they desire God's forgiveness?'" He would say, "You see, He himself gave us an example! We did not die for souls; instead, it was He who shed His divine blood. We must treat souls as he taught us by His example.' He said on another occasion, 'If the Crucifix were to scold me for being too lenient, I would say in return, 'It was You who gave me this bad example, Lord! I have yet to arrive at the madness of dying for souls.'

And yet, this friar who was so good and paternal had his own secret: the priest who welcomed everyone, reassured everyone, and offered everyone the certainty of the boundless Mercy of God, suffered personally from a constant and overwhelming fear of God's judgment. And he felt this even though he once humbly admitted that he had never committed a grave sin, saying, 'I still feel I have the soul of a child.'

Fr. Leopold was asked to live out and undergo the intense and painful beauty of this sacrament – even for his penitents. In his later years, he was so distressed that he sometimes wept throughout the night while being assailed by an unknown terror. Like Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, he too sought out companions to stay with him. Even on his deathbed, witnesses said, 'He looked like Jesus on the cross with the entire sin of the world weighing on him, and he felt abandoned by his Heavenly Father.' He had peace only while speaking to his confessor, when he received the same grace he so readily distributed to others.

It is not easy to explain the glorious and challenging mission that God entrusted to St. Leopold – that of living out and experiencing (even for his penitents) the powerful and dolorous beauty of confession too often unheeded by so many Christians. Too many forget, in fact, that the Sacrament of Penance, together with the Eucharist, makes up the burning heart of Christianity."

St. Gianna's Group was organized in 2011 to advance pro-life issues among the people of St. Philip's. From abortion to euthanasia and from surrogacy to cloning, the Group does what it can to educate the parish and sponsor events which help teach and preach the consistent pro-life message of the Catholic Church. Gianna Francesca Beretta was born in Italy. She was the tenth of thirteen children in her family, only nine of whom survived to adulthood.

In 1949 she received a medical diploma and opened an office near her hometown of Magenta, where she specialized in pediatrics.

Gianna hoped to join her brother, a missionary priest in Brazil, where she intended to offer her medical expertise in gynecology to poor women. However, her chronic ill health made this impractical, and she continued her practice in Italy.

In December 1954, Gianna met Pietro Molla and they married in 1955.

The couple had three children followed by two miscarriages.

In 1961, Gianna was once again expecting. During the second month, Gianna developed a fibroma on her uterus. After examination, the doctors gave her three choices: an abortion, which would save her life and allow her to continue to have children; a complete hysterectomy, which would preserve her life, but take the unborn child's life, and prevent further pregnancy; or removal of only the fibroma, with the potential of further complications. Roman Catholic teaching would have allowed her to obtain a hysterectomy, but would forbid an abortion. Wanting to preserve her child's life, she opted for the removal of the fibroma.

After the operation, complications continued throughout her pregnancy. Gianna was quite clear about her wishes, expressing to her family, "This time it will be a difficult delivery, and they may have to save one or the other — I want them to save my baby."

On April 21, 1962, Good Friday of that year, Gianna went to the hospital, where her fourth child, Gianna Emanuela, was successfully delivered via Caesarean section. However, Gianna continued to have severe pain, and died of septic peritonitis 7 days after the birth.

Gianna was beatified by Pope John Paul II on April 24, 1994, and officially canonized as a saint on May 16, 2004. Gianna's husband Pietro and their last child, Gianna, were present at the canonization ceremony.

The miracle recognized by the Roman Catholic Church to canonize Gianna Molla involved a mother, Elizabeth Comparini, who was 16 weeks pregnant in 2003 and sustained a tear in her placenta that drained her womb of all amniotic fluid. Because a normal term of pregnancy is 40 weeks, Comparini was told by her doctors the baby's chance of survival was "nil."

Through praying to Gianna Molla and asking for her intercession, Comparini delivered by Caesarean a healthy baby despite the lack of amniotic fluid for the remainder of her pregnancy.


