My Two Cents by Fr. Don

December 11, 2016

It has been heartening to see the response from so many in the parish to the charitable opportunities available to us during these holy days. All the "Tubs of Love" disappeared quickly and will soon return filled with blessings for those in need. The Giving Tree items are slowly coming in and the "Servants of Shelter" program continues to provide a warm place to spend the night in area churches (see elsewhere in the bulletin for details on our role this year).

Don't miss our monthly prayer gathering at Planned Parenthood on Saturday, December 17th from 10-11AM. All are welcome. Use good judgment when considering the weather...if the actual temp or the wind chill is below zero we will not be meeting. We will never know how many people are affected by that one hour of prayer a month. We know conversations are taking place in cars that pass by...the honks and gestures show we have hit a nerve. I believe those conversations have saved lives as people are challenged to face the reality of abortion.

Christmas is just three weeks away! Plan ahead and work Christmas Mass into your family schedule. Masses on Saturday, December 24th will be at 4pm, 6:30pm and 10pm. Christmas Day, Sunday, Masses are at 8 and 10 AM. Don't wait for the last minute to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation! This past Friday we celebrated a "Day of Grace" as priests from the area came to St. Philip's to share the Sacrament from 7 AM-8 PM. The Sacrament remains available at 4:30pm each Saturday and between Masses on Sunday mornings.

There is some confusion concerning the envelope which appears every so often in our stewardship packets. It is labeled, "Christian Service" and replaces the old "St. Vincent de Paul" envelope. Funds raised through this collection are used to help local charities fulfill their mission to those in need. So, the name has changed but the ministry and purpose continue. 

Servants of Shelter ~ Opportunity to Volunteer

In response to homelessness in Bemidji, Servants of Shelter was formed by several churches in Bemidji to provide safe nighttime shelter to the homeless, as well as three meals a day. Each week, the shelter moves from church to church and can host up to 20 homeless people at a time. All of the guests go through a background clearance so that volunteers and guests can be given the best assurance of personal safety.

Each year for many years, St. Philips has served as a host to the Servants of Shelter program during the week of Christmas. We work around the school calendar so that we can host while St. Philip's School is not in session. This year, we have an opportunity to host from the evening of December 26 through the morning of January 2.

Guests arrive at 4:00 each afternoon and leave at 8:30 in the morning. We schedule our volunteers for **four hour shifts**, and have two volunteers on each shift. That means that we need no less than 8 volunteers each day of the shelter, plus people to provide meals. We are proud to say that we have a long list of parishioners that have filled shifts over the years, and we consistently receive a yes when we call them to work each year. However, we always need a new group of volunteers to cover this great ministry.




