17th Sunday in Ordinary Time greetings,

The question for this week is simple: Which of these two kinds of people are you? Someone who wakes up in the morning and says, "Good morning, Lord," or someone who wakes up in the morning and says, "Good Lord, its morning.ö In our daily routine, our attitude is so important. Waking up on the wrong side of the bed or having someone notice and say öwhat's wrong with them todayö are signs that our attitude is dictating our approach to life negatively.

I hope everyone has a prayer for the day taped to the bathroom mirror. One of our fellow parishioners used the following prayer every day of his life, sometimes more than once a day:

"O God, I offer you this day all I shall think and do and say, uniting it with what was done on earth by Jesus Christ Thy Son."

In daily prayer: I pray for the spiritual renewal of our parish, diocese, individuals and myself. This allows me to look at those that I encounter in a new light. I can see the light of Christ in others and that brings me joy. It is a possibility you, like I, at times might have said: ömy life is so busy I do not have time to prayö. My solution is not to spend 10 or 15 or 20 minutes at a time in prayer but too consider touching base with God for five seconds before every activity. This is known as giving God the first fruit. It invites God into the moments and activity of our life. When God is present life changes, our attitude can change.

A good conversation to have with your family is to discuss the difference between pleasure and happiness. We must remember pleasure is temporary, and personal happiness is what we strive for. Pope Francis reminds us: öYour happiness has no price... it is not an app you can download to your phone...ö If you want happiness to settle in your heart invite Jesus in to be with you throughout the day in word, deed and thought.

Here is another task to take to prayer: We should now be praying for those who would like to join the Catholic Church through the inquiry and Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) process. This is also important for those who want to complete their Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation). Maybe there is a spouse or two who would like to join the Church? You could surprise your Catholic spouse by calling me and arranging a meeting to discuss the steps necessary to be received into full communion with the Church.

Every August a copy of a column written by Regina Brett, over 90 years old, of Cleveland, Ohio pops upí She said: "To celebrate growing older, I once wrote the lessons life taught me. It is the most-requested column I've ever written.ö Here is a part of the column:

Life isn't fair, but it's still good. When in doubt, just take the next small step. Life is too short to waste time hating anyone. Believe in miracles. Always choose life. Forgive everyone everything. Your job won't take care of you when you are sick... Your friends and parents will. Stay in touch. God loves you because of who God is, not because of anything you did or didn't do. You don't have to win every argument. Agree to disagree. Cry with someone. It's more healing than crying alone. It's OK to let your children see you cry. Its OK to get angry with God. He can take it. No one is in charge of your happiness but you. When it comes to chocolate, resistance is futile. Make peace with your past so it won't screw up the present. If a relationship has to be a secret, you shouldn't be in it... The most important sex organ is the brain. What other people think of you is none of your business. Frame every so-called disaster with these words 'In five years, will this matter?'

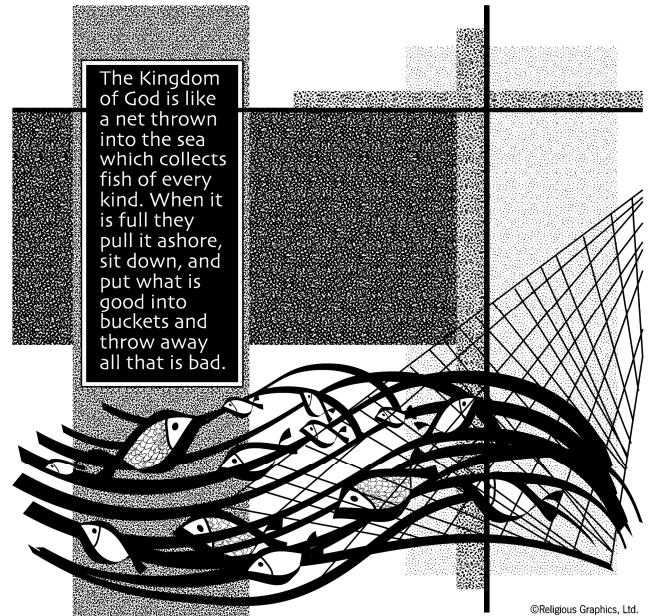

To involve young people in preparations for the Synod of Bishops on youth in 2018, the Vatican has released an online questionnaire to better understand the lives, attitudes and concerns of 16 to 29-year-olds around the world. The questionnaire —available in English, Spanish, French, and Italian—can be found on the Synod's official site: youth.synod2018.va/content/synod2018/it.html and is open to any young person, regardless of faith or religious belief. The answers to the questionnaire, along with contributions from bishops, bishops' conferences and other church bodies, "will provide the basis for the drafting of the working document, for the assembly, synod officials said in January. Young people from all backgrounds are encouraged to take part in the questionnaire because every young person has "the right to be accompanied without exclusion," synod officials had said.
