August 27, 2017

This is a special bulletin. Normally we print 650 to 700 copies, this week, all 1472 families in the parish are receiving a copy. Between this mail-out bulletin and the letter that will arrive Monday or Tuesday, you will have updates on lawsuits, progress on the long-range plan, lightning strike update, school news and the latest fiscal year financial and statistical info.

This summer has been powerful for anointing of the sick and those who were dying. As the celebrant, several times my heart filled with gratitude as I witnessed the power of the love of Jesus. I watched someone struggling with breathing, catch their breath, and relax; I listened as someone struggling with a terminal diagnosis said õIt is now in Godøs hands.ö I looked on and shared the joy of someone who felt great relief as a burden of stress was lifted from her life. The Anointing of the Sick is powerful. It is a blessing to receive this Sacrament more than once in your life. It is not only for those close to death. It is a Sacrament that can heal... literallyí It heals our relationship with God. It makes us right with God. Through this Sacrament God chooses to forget our sinsí He grants peace and comfort. Through the prayers of the church we call forth saints and angels and the power of the Spirit to affect our lives and our attitudes. Thanks, be to God for this powerful giftí

When I visited a family, it was bedtime for the young members of the family: We prayed their night prayers; to close, dad asked each child to tell God three things you are thankful for todayí I was so impressed I later told mom and dadí õGood Job, thanks for letting me be part of your eveningö. Thanks be to God for this family trying to get to heaven together.

A shared observation is that people seem to be getting attached to their electronic devices to the detriment of their friendships and families. This might take courage on the part of spouses and parents but what would happen if we as a parish supported one another by declaring a ban on electronic devices and screens in our homes for one hour a day or even better every Saturday became: õUnplugged Saturdayö. For a single person like myself it could be time I spend reading or reaching out in a letter or visit to another person? For a family, what if the time was spent in conversation or having family game time? By unplugging would we be able to change the world for the better here in Bemidji?

I love to save quotes from various writers and I found this one that has deep meaning. It was entitled: What's Wrong with Gossip? By Eberhard Arnold: ôThere is no law but love. Love is joy in others. Therefore it should be out of the question to speak about another person in a spirit of irritation or vexation. There must never be talk, either in open remarks or by insinuation, against anyone, or against their individual characteristicsô and under no circumstances behind their back. Gossiping in one family is no exception. Direct address is the brotherly or sisterly service we owe anyone whose weaknesses cause a negative reaction in us. An open word spoken directly to another person deepens friendship and will not be resented.ö

Let us pray for peaceful conversations and the Lords helpí
