Our second reading this weekend from St. Paul's letter to the Romans talks about the importance of love in the world. God's commandments which deal with our relationships with others are summed up in this saying, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no evil to the neighbor. What a beautiful city, state, country and world we could have if everyone lived up to this simple statement. The whole world could be like the Garden of Eden.

Saint Paul proposed to the Romans that if they truly loved their neighbor as themselves there would be no murder, theft, adultery, or even coveting. That all could live in peace and harmony. May each of us strive to live in this way and pray that our neighbors do the same.

In the Gospel for today from Matthew, Jesus is teaching his disciples how to carefully handle the situation when a neighbor does not live in love. Jesus teaches to approach the neighbor with respect. Go to him one on one and share with him how you feel he has wronged you. If he listens, perhaps forgiveness can result and compromise be reached. Friendship may be formed. If no agreement is found we may need to involve backup, such as a couple of friends. If still no resolution is found the next step is to involve the authorities. Depending on the situation, this may be church authorities or civil authorities. However, we should always be looking for a fair and just solution, not for revenge or to hurt the other person.

My prayer for St. Philip's, our parish and school, is that all will know us and remember us as a community that lives by the message of the Gospel of Jesus, a community of love!

It is a very busy place around here this month as we begin our new school year and prepare to start our new year of Faith Formation. Please remember to keep St. Philip's School and Faith Formation programs in your prayers.






