Children and the Liturgy by Aana Freihammer

September 24, 2017

Several years ago a friend told me the story of their toddler who was playing Mass in their living room. He had processed around with the kitchen with a broom and ended at a coffee table covered in a blanket. He then held a plastic toy cup in the air and said "here's the bread, and here's the beer, and now it's time for the pancake breakfast!"

This story is one of my favorites. Besides a child hilariously thinking that the wine at Mass was beer, it illustrates how fascinating our Sunday liturgy can be for a child. In many ways, I believe children are best suited for liturgy. This is because children get their first realization of heaven from their experiences in imaginary play. Young children live in a world where anything can happen, like Santa Clause, tooth fairies, and dragons. A box becomes a submarine; a stick becomes a magical wand. They have a much easier time accepting a transcendent reality attached to their earthly experience. At this fun stage of life, children do not restrict their vision to what they can see, hear, taste, and touch, because everything in life can mean something more.

We all grow out of the childishness of imaginary play, but along with this maturity, we can lose the skill to see heaven and to experience God in all things. Maybe you have thought to yourself "this is pointless, and archaic, why go to Mass? It all means nothing." The ritual on Sunday can feel empty and trivial without the richness of faith that helps us to see beyond. We lose the expansiveness of our faith with the blindness of becoming realistic and practical. By losing the sense of the sacredness and the ethereal in our everyday lives and especially our Sunday liturgy, we miss out on the opportunity to fully understand the most important prayer of the Church.

Everything you see in liturgy, the words, actions, symbols, objects are meant to speak to the transubstantiation of Christ becoming bread and wine. This is particularly fitting for the liturgy to work in this way, as the word "liturgy" comes from the Greek word "leiturgia" meaning work of the people. You get the sense that the Church intended the entire people of God literally working together towards the transformation from this world into the next, participating together in a greater mystery of God's grace.

If you have ever sat in one of my choir rehearsals before, the first thing that I teach is our function as musicians in the liturgy. I liken liturgical music to a "window to Christ." In a window, the viewer passes through the transparent glass to see the image beyond. In the same way when we sing liturgically, the music sweeps us into a heavenly reality, and the performative components disappear.

At Sunday Mass, always have your "liturgy glasses," and ask the question "What is this object (or action) telling us about our faith?" The table is not just a table, but a sacrificial altar where Christ becomes present to us in bread and wine. The podium is not just a podium, but an ambo in which a minister proclaims the salvation of God. The music is not just sound, but an experience of unity and a dialogue with God. The water is not just H₂O; but a symbol of spiritual cleansing and renewal into the Church of God. The guy up front is not just Father Chuck or Father Don, but "in persona Christi," the presider and priest of the sacrifice.

Seeing with these new eyes of faith helps us to see God in every moment of our lives. We no longer see just a tree in the yard, but God's creation, illustrating His goodness. We don't just see the poor, but our brother or sister loved unconditionally by God. Everything we do and see in the world become an opportunity to see Christ. I suppose this is why Christ seemed to enjoy being around children in the Gospels. He didn't have to work extra hard at helping them see the grace in everyday life, and maybe he felt a little closer to his heavenly home by playing imagination with them. Be sure to ask your kids today what they saw at Mass this weekend, and where they saw God. You might be surprised at their theological insights.

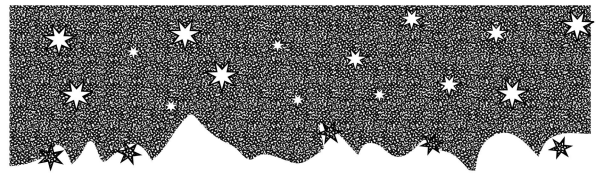

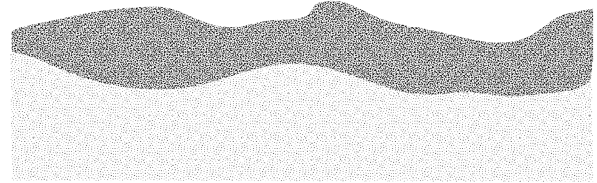
