October 1, 2017

Welcome to our 2nd mail out bulletiní We want to spread the message of Jesus with all the members of St Philipøs and St Charles. This bulletin contains many articles and offers opportunities for us to be with and for others.

Our readings for this weekend ask what is your opinion, what is your attitude; there is no question Scripture calls us have the attitude of Jesus Christ. We all know someone or have heard from someone: õthey (you) have an attitude!ö Life experiences influence our attitude. Generally, our attitude can range from harsh to courteous. Two quotes from Pope Francis ring true: õLet your week reflect the God you worship on Sundayö and õWe are the voice of Jesus Christ in the world todayö. Both statements are challenging and if they are true, then we might need to reflect on how we react to others. Do we see Jesus in the other person or is the other person just in the way or wanting to get something out of us?

So what is your attitude or what is your opinion? Does every person have a story to tell and is it worth taking the time to listen to the story? Does every person have a reason to be thankful or a need they would like our help in praying for? Would it make a difference if at the end of Mass, we turned to one another and said: What are you thankful for today or can I pray for you or something important to you today? Would it make a difference? When I asked a young woman in our parish, she said: it would depend on your attitudeí She wondered if people would even do such a thing, so I ask: would you, do it?

Interesting story: Ruth went to her mail box and found one letter. Odd, no stamp, no postmark, only her name and address. It read: *Dear Ruth: I'm going to be in your neighborhood Saturday afternoon and I'd like to stop by for a visit. Love Always, Jesus.* Her hands shook. "Why would the Lord want to visit me? Iøm nobody special." Ruth remembered: õI don't have anything to offer. I'll run to the store and buy something for dinner." She counted her money. Five dollars and forty cents. "Well, I can get some bread and cold cuts, at least." She threw on her coat and hurried to the store. A loaf of French bread, a ½ pound of sliced turkey, and a carton of milkí leaving a total twelve cents to last until Monday. She headed home, her meager offerings under her arm. "Hey lady, can you help us?" Ruth was absorbed in her plans, she didnøt notice.

A man and a woman, both dressed in rags "Look lady, I ain't got a job, ya know, and my wife and I have been living out here on the street, and, well, now it's getting cold and we're getting kinda hungry and, well, if you could help us. Lady, we'd really appreciate it." Ruth looked at them, both were dirty, they smelled bad and she was certain that they could get work if they wanted to. "Sir, I'd like to help you, but I'm a poor woman. All I have is a few cold cuts and bread, and I'm having an important guest for dinner tonight and I was planning on serving that to Him." "Yeah, okay lady, I understand. Thanks anyway." The man and woman held hands and headed into the alley. As they left, Ruth felt a twinge in her heart. "Sir, wait!" The couple stopped and turned. She said: "Look, take this food. I'll figure out something else for my guest." He took the bag. "Thank you, lady!" "Yes, thank you!" Said the man's shivering wife. Ruth said: "You know, I've got another coat at home. Here take this one." Ruth placed her coat over the woman's shoulders. Then smiling, she turned and walked home...without her coat and with nothing to serve her guest. "Ruth was chilled at her front door and worried too. The Lord was coming to visit and she didn't have anything to offer Him. She placed the key in the lock and noticed another envelope in her mailbox. "That's odd. Mail twice in one day" She read the new letter: Dear Ruth: It was so good to see you again. Thank you for the lovely meal and the beautiful coat. Love Always Jesus. The air was cold, but even without her coat, Ruth no longer noticed.

What is your attitude or what is your opinion? How does it affect the way we act on the words of Pope Francis: õLet Your week reflect the God you worship on Sundayö and õWe are the voice of Jesus Christ in the world todayö?
