Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

October 22, 2017

Next week, thousands of Halloween costumes will be bought or made across the country in anticipation of the big night a week from Tuesday. There will be ghosts and witches, skeletons, zombies, pirates, Spider Men and Wonder Women. A huge amount of time, talent, and treasure will be expended to pretend for a few hours to be something on the outside that we're not on the inside. In contrast to Halloween, in today's Gospel, Jesus is trying to show us how important it is to be consistent, inside and outside, in what we say, do and believe.

The Pharisees and Herodians (*who couldn't agree about much*), did agree that Jesus challenged their respective, comfortable world views. For the Pharisees, a respectable life could only be achieved by a strict and full obedience to Jewish law. The Herodians were practical politicians, bent on keeping peace with Rome and maintaining their own comfort and power. They went along to get along.

But as we know, Jesus teaches us that the goal of human life is neither respectability nor comfort. What Jesus taught offended both the Pharisees and Herodians, and they thought that together they would trick Him with a question about taxes. If Jesus answered yes, he'd be in trouble with the Jews who hated the tax. If Jesus answered no, he'd be in trouble with the Romans who wanted the tax money.

So, Jesus turned the question about taxes into a more important question: How are we supposed to relate to God? Jesus teaches us that the goal of human life is to have honest relationships with God and our neighbor. What was really inside the heart of the Herodians and Pharisees who questioned him wasn't a search for wisdom, but a scheme to get Jesus in trouble instead of listening and learning from Him.

If we want to claim that we worship God on the outside when we know others are listening to us and watching what we do, then we must consistently worship God on the inside, too. After all, the inside worship that we offer to God must be with a humble heart, always eager to give our best to Him.

Jesus challenged the world views of the religious and political parties of His time in order to show us that we can best offer true worship to God, when what we do is consistent with the faith we proclaim.

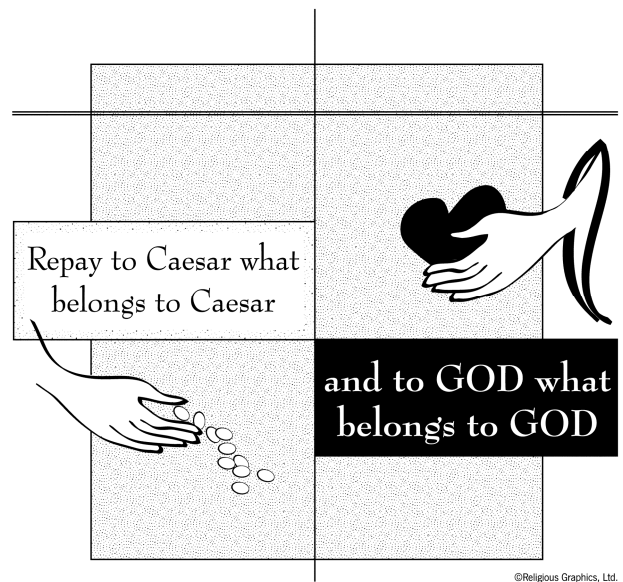

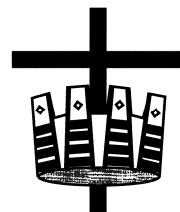

Consider being a part of this important effort to build a diocesan and statewide community of Catholics who stand together as a positive force for good in Minnesota.

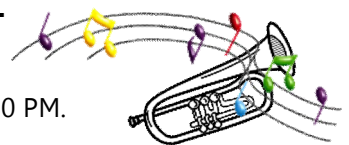

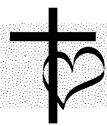
St. Philip's School Staff Spotlight

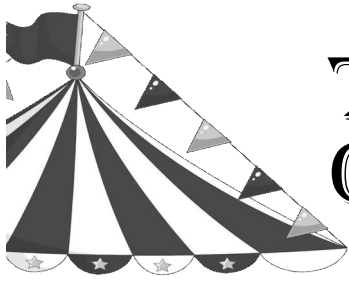


Following are the reasons women gave for their abortions (more than one reason could be given):

Adoration Etiquette

Following the opening of adoration guidelines: Jesus is placed in the monstrance at the beginning of the time for adoration. When we enter the chapel we either genuflect or bow toward the monstrance with Jesus in it. Many times people will stop for 10, 15 or 30 minutes during the time a regularly scheduled adorer is present. Occasionally the regularly scheduled person needs to leave and the next scheduled person has not arrived. If this happens to you simply take the veil (it is on the small table next to the altar) and place it over the monstrance with Jesus in it. When the next adorer arrives they can remove the veil and continue adoration. The last adorer of the evening will follow the guidelines for reposition of the Blessed Sacrament. These instructions can be found in the adoration book on the bookcase in the chapel. Thank you for taking time to visit with Jesus.
