Sacred Silence by Aana Freihammer

As you may have noticed, starting in Advent we have spent a little more time emphasizing the Church's prescribed moments of silence in our liturgies. The documents require five specific moments of sacred silence for contemplation of the ritual.

- Before the Penitential Rite (when we ask for forgiveness)
- Before the opening prayer ("Let us pray...")
- After the readings
- After the homily
- After Communion

The Church prioritizes silence as a medium in which we find God. Mother Theresa writes "We need to find God, and he cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence. See how nature - trees, flowers, grass- grows in silence; see the stars, the moon and the sun, how they move in silence... We need silence to be able to touch souls." Mother Theresa would require her religious order to spend an hour in adoration before they began working with the poor. You would think that it would have been far more productive for her sisters to be out working with the countless destitute for that hour rather than sitting, but she valued her sisters' connection to God rather than hollow productivity.

Sacred silence also sharpens what I like to call our "Narnian senses." If you've read the Chronicles of Narnia or remember the movie, four siblings find a portal to a magical world through a coat wardrobe. As they come back from the magical world, the busy world around them and the duties of growing up causes them to forget the magical world of adventure. Much like our experience today, our world has this unique ability to make us forget about heaven, to forget that God is present and loves us. Our "God amnesia" makes us think that our productivity and experiences here on earth are all we have, rather than vehicles to heaven. Silence sharpens our ability to see God here on earth, no matter what we are doing, and no matter what we are seeing. Silence helps us to "see" heaven in the sunrise, in a friendship, in a cup of coffee, or in our children.

Silence for some can be irritating and boring. As soon as the visual and auditory noise stops, the mind turns to a vacuum of endless thoughts and tasks. The inside of the mind can feel noisier than the outside world. There are just so many things to get done! For some, the silence isn't just irritating and overwhelming, it is also scary. It can be a space of loneliness, where past tragedies haunt the mind, and insecurities attack the heart. Please do not hesitate to seek professional help if you find that silence unbearable for you.

Spending time in silence is the cornerstone to helping us live like we are made for heaven rather than earth. It is simply sitting with God, and realizing His love for us. Through our silent experiences, we candidly wrestle with the complexity of our lives, and learn to live our life facing contradictions and suffering. Struggling in the loving presence of God helps us find peace. We become more of who we're meant to be.

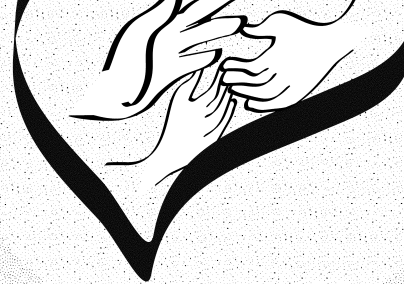
