2nd Sunday of Lent Greetings,

February 25, 2018

Do you think the devil seemed more persistent this week than normal? As I discussed with a parishioner: We work hard at our Lenten intentions and the devil works harder to see if he can get us to fizzle out on our good intentions. Remember if you have been unable to fulfill your intention, START again... the devil like someone who is a quitter. God loves a person who acknowledges they failed and starts again...

Too often we underestimate the power of a touch, a smile, a kind word, a listening ear, an honest compliment, or the smallest act of caring, all of which have the potential to turn a life around. People come into our lives for a reason, a season, or a lifetime! Embrace all equally.

This weekend we celebrate Transfiguration Sunday, the day the three apostles witnessed Jesus in his glory to be revealed to the world after his death and resurrection. Have you contemplated what our soul will be like after death... we know we will see Jesus, be judged and we will face Heaven or Hell. Some people say there is no Hell, just by proclaiming the name of Jesus is enough to save everyone. Sorry but that is wrong.

Our Catholic teaching is that we proclaim our belief in Jesus and it will affect our lives, we will live differently, we will help those that are imprisoned be free, (Do not let the word prison limit your understanding) People are and can be imprisoned by thoughts, fears, and actions of others...we can free them just by listening or spending time with them.

We also are called to feed the hungry. (Do let the word "hunger" denote only food?) Some people hunger for companionship, understanding, knowledge. It is up to us to feed others. One of my favorite expressions is: Do not count the sheep... feed them...

We are called to cloth the naked. This could also be a call to stop abortions, neglect of children, the rampant use of pornography, lustful abuse of the other person; can you believe Minnesota is one of the worst states for human trafficking? We are called to be a people who cry out against injustice...

Just a reminder about the powerful sacrament of Reconciliation: We celebrate this sacrament whenever someone calls us, or on the regular weekend schedule. In addition, a special celebration all day on March 16th from 7 AM to 7 PM, as few as 2 priests per hour and as many as 4 priests per hour. This year we have Mass, the fish fry, and a special exhibit of Eucharistic Miracles. Watch the bulletin for more information. Mark your calendar!

Have a blessed Lenten week... practice: prayer, fasting and almsgiving...do not let the devil win... Fr. Chuck



Grieving Resource Library

If you have lost a loved one, maybe you have felt one of the following during your grief: "It can't be, it just can't be; I never knew that it would hurt so much; part of my heart has been ripped away; no one ever told me that grief felt so much like fear; no one knows the tears still inside me; and finally, death leaves a heartache no one can heal, love leaves a memory no one can steal."

Where do I find help? At St. Philip's. We have started to develop a Grieving Resource Library. We currently have 30-some books and pamphlets that could help you through your grief of the loss of a loved one.

Some of the books we carry are: **Getting Past** Christmas, tips for surviving December after the death of a loved one; When Bad Things Happen to Good People, how to cope with hard times and personal pain after the loss of a loved one. The Gift of a Memory, a warm and gentle gift of love that commemorates the loss of a special life and celebrates our most cherished memories: **Too Soon A** *Memory*, a guide for parents suffering a miscarriage. This booklet focuses on the needs of parents who have to deal with a loss that involved tangible memories. Journey **Through Grief,** a series of four books: Book one, A Time to Grieve, the three N's, normal, natural, necessary. Book two, Experiencing Grief, when your loss sinks in, accepting your grief, secondary losses. Book three, Finding Hope and Healing, how much longer God? How long does this last? Book Four, Rebuilding and Remembering, permission to grieve – again, the first anniversary, rebuilding your life, continuing bonds.

The books/pamphlets are located in the St. Kateri room and can be checked out for 2 weeks or more if you need to. If you are not sure which book could assist you, contact either Fr. Chuck, Fr. Don, Deacon Kermit or Deacon Robb. "The journey of grieving takes you from loving in the presence to loving in the absence."
