March. Hard to believe! Lent "marches" on!

Don't miss the "Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit" present at St. Philip's the weekend of March 16 to March 18. The bread and wine we offer at Mass truly become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. It is so because Jesus said it was so at the Last Supper! If you need more evidence of this miraculous truth, check out the exhibit.

The exhibit opens at 6pm on Thursday, March 15th with an official presentation at 7 PM. Friday, March 16th the exhibit is open from 8 AM-8 PM with presentations made at 12:30, 4 and 7:15 PM. 



The Real Presence?

Are you able to accept that the bread & wine become the actual body and blood of Jesus? Many have struggled with this belief, even some disciples of Jesus (read John 6:26-70). In 8th-century Italy the presiding monk asked God to help his unbelief. His prayers were answered when the bread & wine became actual flesh and blood during the consecration. This is miraculous in itself, but add to that the results of scientific testing conducted on un-preserved samples nearly 1200 years later. The flesh & blood contained proteins found in fresh, normal blood. The blood type was AB (universal receiver) matching the Shroud of Turin, and the flesh was determined to be heart tissue. 


