Greetings on the Fourteenth & Fifteenth Sundays in Ordinary Time

July 8/15

"He was amazed at their lack of faith." These are the final words in the Gospel for the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Jesus was preaching and teaching in his native place, his home, Nazareth. The local citizens (Jewish) of his home town did not believe this was the Jesus they had once thought, they were astonished at his wisdom and knowledge, so much so, "they took offense at him." How difficult it must have been for Jesus to come home, the place he spent most of his earthly life, and be rejected by familiar faces. During Jesus' earthly ministry he astonished many if not most people, even the apostles were astonished, taken back, and captivated by Jesus. How often are we astonished by Jesus? Do we often forget who he is and what he is capable of accomplishing? We have a tendency as people to struggle with faith at times, even to the point of despair, wondering if God is even present right here and now. God's work is ever present but we as people, as sinners, as rational beings tend to either overanalyze or bypass God's work to our own detriment. Our minds cannot grasp everything in this life or in this universe, we are limited in many ways, but it is through the light of faith that we begin to believe and grasp that which seems most difficult. It is often pride that holds our faith hostage, as it did with the Jews in Nazareth, Jesus was not merely amazed because of their lack of faith but their lack of receptivity to believe. When we overanalyze our faith, bypass God's work, think we can understand or grasp anything or everything in this life, we begin to hold our faith hostage, we begin to lack the appropriate receptivity to believe. St. Bernard of Clairvaux once said, "I hold fast by faith what I cannot grasp with my mind." May we always remain humble in order to receive the gift of faith and believe in the astonishment of our Lord.

"Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two..." These are powerful words echoed in the Gospel reading for the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Just last month some youth from St. Philip's parish took a mission trip to the country of Haiti. Bringing the love of their faith in Jesus Christ they embarked (were sent forth) on a journey of a lifetime. The Lord would make known to them the need and importance for missionary disciples in this world, especially in the country of Haiti. They will be presenting to the parish their experiences, stories, and pictures following the liturgies the weekend of July 14/15. "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." Regardless of the challenges or difficulties the youth may have experienced during their journey, let us keep them in prayer that the Lord has presented them with experiences which shape their faith and draw them ever closer to the heart of Jesus. May we as a parish welcome them home and remind them that we are a faith community, one body in Christ, and know our Lord summons us all to go out to all the ends of the earth to proclaim the good news!




