Nineteenth Sunday Greetings,

August 12, 2018

This coming Wednesday, August 15th, we celebrate The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. After being told by the Angel Gabriel that she would bear a son, the only Son of God, who she was to name Jesus, she went immediately to Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting the child in her womb leaped for joy. Elizabeth cried out, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." She then proclaimed, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

And Mary said: "May soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his Name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, and has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever."

As a Deacon I pray this canticle of Mary every evening in the Liturgy of the Hours. This has become one of my favorite passages of Sacred Scripture. It is very good to proclaim the greatness of the Lord and to acknowledge that he does great things in my life. I am grateful that he has mercy on those who fear him and that he remembers his promise of mercy that he made to his people.

I pray that each of you will take fifteen minutes sometime between now and Wednesday to meditate on and pray Mary's canticle. Thank God for looking on you his lowly servant with favor and for all the blessings he has bestowed on you. He has remembered his promise of mercy and offers his grace and mercy to each one of us, as he promised to Abraham and his children forever.




