May We Become What We Eat!

We seem to pay a lot of attention to healthy food these days. We've become accustomed to reading labels for ingredients and nutrients. We see the term "organic" attached to more items in the grocery store, as well as "no trans-fats", "gluten free" and "low sodium". Even the fast-food industry has made adjustments. Are we forgetting, however, to promote a healthy spiritual diet ... the Eucharist?

Over the past few weeks as we've been reading the Gospel of John, we've heard Jesus offering himself and His teaching as true wisdom ... the bread of life. The "gourmet meal" of the Eucharist enables us sacramentally to take that wisdom into ourselves through the act of eating and drinking, with results that can be truly be wondrous.

Jesus is God's word, who was made flesh and lived among us. He brings God's teaching to us. He is "the way, the truth, and the life." By following Him, we are able to "forsake foolishness and advance in the way of understanding."

Jesus multiplied bread and fish, to show that He, God's wisdom, could set a table in the desert and feed a multitude. He fed the crowd, and when they continued to follow Him, He taught them that He had a different kind of food to feed them, something much better. Yet, when Jesus said "My flesh is real food, and my blood real drink," the crowd was shocked. "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"... "how can He claim for himself the attributes of wisdom, and the power to grant eternal life?"

Jesus wants us to be so united with Him that we make Him present in today's world. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me and I in him or her." By receiving Jesus sacramentally, digesting Him, His teaching and His way of life, we can have eternal life. And He will raise us up on the last day.

There is no earthly diet healthier than this. Somehow, many of us have lost sight of this fact. Many Catholics no longer attend Mass. Many attend only occasionally. They don't know or have forgotten what they're missing. Is our own indifference or sense of dull routine responsible for this? Do we celebrate the Eucharist with the enthusiasm and sense of privilege that it deserves? If not, what can we do? We must try, as Paul wrote to the Ephesians, to "Be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs. Sing to the Lord in your hearts. Giving thanks always and for everything."

If we can only come to understand the treasure we have in the holy Eucharist, we'll begin to:

- Look forward to coming to Mass.
- Take time to make ourselves ready ... get to church on time, and not leave early.
- Gladly join the prayers and hymns.
- Receive holy Communion with reverence and joy.

Jesus reminds us how important the Eucharist is in our lives: "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you . . . As the living Father sent me, and I have life, because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me." Unlike our ancient ancestors who ate manna in the desert and the multitude who ate loaves and fish, "whoever eats this bread will live forever."

As we come to Mass to partake of the banquet prepared for us by God's wisdom, may we become what we eat, Jesus, the bread of life.


