Hopefully this week you will have the time to review the annual report of the parish. This report showcases the stewardship practices of our parish,

- ✓ In the investment of time, in the many ministries,
- ✓ In the investment of talent: in the opportunities to be of service with and for others,
- ✓ In the investment of resources: that are used to financially provide the programs and events that help us deepen our relationship with Jesus.

Our parish is an example of the heart of Jesus, living, pulsing with life and inviting others to a deeper relationship with Jesus.

How does a person go about taking the pulse of a community: the pulse of a family, the pulse of a parish? When we know what the general trend is, when we have a feel for what people are thinking, then we can progress with confidence. But how do you get the pulse? You listen, you ask questions and you invite people to participate.

In the annual report is a very important survey regarding mass times... We invite your input. Two people asked me directly, "Father, have you already decided what the new Mass times will be? How soon will you make the changes?" My response was simple: There is not a predetermined outcome or timetable. That is not to say I do not have my own insight as to how it may turn out... We are not going to make any changes without parish input. This is a complex situation that has many factors to consider. We will do this prayerfully and with all factors being weighed before a final decision is made.

A vibrant parish such as ours needs to be responsive to the changing needs of our members and our community. Our goal is to always be open to the response necessary but to implement it after prayerful and discerning thought. Experience in life teaches us that change is hard when we do not understand the why of the change. Maybe we were not present when it was explained or we just like it the way it has been for many years. Sometimes we need to make changes because a law or code changed. Sometimes suggestions are made and after discussion a change is made. A good rule of thumb is to ask questions of the right person if we are unsure as to the how or why of a change.

Thinking back to 2010 when the Mass was changed, there were questions and struggles with some of the changes. Today we see that those changes helped us in our effort to respond fully and actively as we celebrate the liturgy.

Fr. Bryan, Dcn. Kermit, Dcn. Robb and myself are taking a bold step... we meet every week along with Aana and one of us presents our preparation for an upcoming homily. The others then share their insight into the Scripture readings of the day chosen. Another of the four clerics receives valuable feedback from the group regarding a homily we have recently given. Each week, starting this November, one homily will be chosen by the group to seek input from between two to four parishioners on a preprinted form. Please be open to assisting us as we work to improve our homilies. You do not need to sign the form but to be open and honest in your comments.

May God bless you and keep you always... Thanks be to God for the parishes of St Philip's and St Charles. Please remember the souls of the faithful departed especially during the month of November. Jesus loves you and so do I... *Fr. Chuck*

HANDS TOGETHER

Next weekend our parish participates in the diocesan Mission Cooperative Plan and we welcome Laurie Hittman, who works with the missions in Haiti. Mission groups are assigned to every parish to speak about the work of our church in other parts of the world and to remind us that our church is fundamentally a Mission church. Our diocesan mission office assigned Hands Together, a Catholic mission outreach working in Haiti, to share with us news of how our church continues to help the poorest of the poor.

In Haiti there are 10.9 million people in an area smaller than Maryland. 70% of these cannot read, and 85% live below poverty level. In slum areas 4 out of 5 children do not reach the age of five, and nationally 1 in 3 children suffer from chronic malnutrition. The hurricanes in 2004 and 2008, along with the devastating earthquake and hurricane of 2010 have left Haiti severely damaged and in desperate need of our prayers and support.

Hands Together runs free schools, medical clinics and nutrition programs in Cite Soleil, providing 25,000 school meals daily and helping thousands of people who struggle to survive. Hands Together embraces a clear ethic of life based on Catholic teaching that proclaims God's infinite and absolute love for us. About one-third of Hands Together's mission work supports educational, health, charity, and developmental projects in City Soleil, the Dioceses of Gonaïves and Cap-Haïtien.

Charitable Contributions from IRAs

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 first allowed taxpayers age 70½ and older to make tax-free charitable donations directly from their IRAs. By making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) from an IRA directly to a qualified charitable organization, older IRA owners were allowed to exclude up to \$100,000 annually from gross income. These gifts, also known as "charitable IRA rollovers," would otherwise be taxable IRA distributions. The law was originally scheduled to expire in 2007, but was finally made permanent by the Protecting Americans from Tax Hikes (PATH) Act of 2015.

How QCDs Work

You must be 70½ or older in order to be eligible to make QCDs. You simply instruct your IRA trustee to make a distribution directly from your IRA (other than SEP and SIMPLE IRAs) to a qualified charity. The distribution must be one that would otherwise be taxable to you. You can exclude up to \$100,000 of QCDs from your gross income each year. And if you file a joint return, your spouse (if 70½ or older) can exclude an additional \$100,000 of QCDs. Note: You don't get to deduct QCDs as a charitable contribution on your federal income tax return — that would be double-dipping.

QCDs count toward satisfying any required minimum distributions (RMDs) that you would otherwise have to receive from your IRA, just as if you had received an actual distribution from the plan. However, distributions that you actually receive from your IRA (including RMDs) and subsequently transfer to a charity cannot qualify as QCDs.

Marriage Banns (c. 1067) refers to the public announcement of a proposed marriage. The purpose of the Marriage Banns is to offer the faithful the opportunity to exercise their obligation to reveal to the pastor any impediments to a proposed marriage (c. 1069). The following are impediments to Marriage:

- **Holy Orders.** Has the groom ever been ordained a deacon or a priest in the Catholic Church?
Public **perpetual vow** of chastity in a religious institute. Has either the bride or the groom been member of a religious community?
- **Crime.** (killing someone's spouse with the view of marrying the surviving spouse)
- **Age.** Will either the bride or the groom be under the age of 14 or 16 respectively, at the time of the wedding? (Civil law states a person needs the consent of the parents if under the age of 18.)
- **Antecedent and perpetual impotence.** Is the bride or groom incapable of sexual intercourse because of injury or some other medical or psychological condition?
- **Marriage.** Has either the bride or the groom been married previously? Has the previous marriage received a declaration of nullity?
- **Abduction.** Refers to the kidnapping of a person who later becomes engaged to the kidnapper.
- **Consanguinity:** Blood relationship between persons who descend from a common ancestor in all degrees of the direct line (Father-daughter or Mother-son), and to up to the fourth degree of the collateral line (first cousins). Are the bride and groom related to one another by blood?
- **Affinity** (relationships because of marriage) any degree in the direct line. Are the bride and groom related through marriage?
- **Adoption.** Are the bride and groom related through adoption?
- **Public Propriety.** The impediment arises from an invalid marriage after the establishment of common life or from notorious or public concubinage (cohabitation between a man and a woman without marriage). It nullifies marriage in the first degree of the direct line between the man and the blood relatives of the woman, and vice versa (c. 1093).
- **One Man and One Woman.** Sex change or reassignment. Has either the bride or groom lived as the opposite sex or had surgery to physically alter their gender? (c. 1056)
