From the Desk of Fr. Bryan

November 4, 2018

The month of November is traditionally devoted to praying for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. A brief explanation of Purgatory: while we are here on earth, we tend to sin (a.k.a. rebel) against the Lord God. These sins have consequences: they prevent us from seeing God clearly, they attach us to earthly pleasures, they darken our intellects...many consequences. Of course, we can go to Confession - we need to go to Confession - for the forgiveness of our sins, especially for any deadly/ mortal sins we commit. This reconciliation with the Lord God helps to set us on the way toward Heaven, but the effects of our sins remain. We still need to be purified of our earthly attachments before we can enter into Eternal Life with God. After all, the Book of Revelation says that "nothing unclean shall enter" Heaven (Rev. 21:27). St. Paul refers to it as a testing by fire (1 Cor 3:15), where all of our works will be tested by fire. The things that are precious to God will remain and the sinful effects will be burned away, just as gold or silver would remain and the dirt would be burned away in a fire. Being in Purgatory hurts like Hell, since that soul is being purified by fire (not a fun experience!), but there remains a sweet taste, since that soul knows Heaven is on the horizon. Somehow, our prayers can help the souls in Purgatory be purified faster, helping them escape the fire sooner and enter into the sweet Life of Heaven, bathed in God's radiant light. Mmm... What a beautiful gift to help our beloved dead enter into Paradise! So often we just assume our beloved dead go straight to Heaven, while it's more likely that they first need to suffer the purification of Purgatory for a while. Let's make sure to pray for our beloved dead this month, either through fasting or Masses or some form of self-denial, asking the Lord to bring them Home quickly. Then they will see our charity toward them and happily pray for us. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace!

We have some truly great feast days this month, a couple of important ones have already occurred. All Saints' Day (1st) was a Holy Day of Obligation, so hopefully you attended Mass to rejoice in the saints who already reside with God for eternity. All Souls' Day (2nd) was the very next day, which is the prime day the Church sets aside to pray for all of the souls in Purgatory, especially for those who have no one to pray for them. The last Sunday of this month is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (25th). It's the final Sunday of Ordinary Time, and it's the day we all renew our commitment to living under the Kingship of Jesus Christ. We also have some great saints to inspire us this month: an apostle in St. Andrew (30th); a couple great popes in Leo the Great (10th) and Clement I (23rd); some very holy martyrs in Cecilia (22nd), Josaphat (12th), Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions (24th), and Miguel Agustin Pro (23rd); a foundress of a religious order in the United States in Frances Xavier Cabrini (13th); a couple of excellent bishops in Charles Borromeo (4th) and Albert the Great (15th); a princess who married and later became a religious sister in Elizabeth of Hungary. There are more still, but there is only so much room on the front of this bulletin! It's truly a blessed month to cherish the grace of God, which has raised up so many great saints throughout the history of the Church. We continue to rejoice in his glory, even as we pray and fast for the benefit of those who are being purified after death.

May the Lord give you his peace! -Fr. Bryan






