Greetings on the Feast of Christ the King!

We just celebrated Thanksgiving and thoughts appropriate to this time of year appeared on my computer screen... "Life is better with an attitude of gratitude!" those 8 words call to mind the effect our attitude has on daily life... A real pearl of wisdom I have encountered is two parts worth contemplating: "If you concentrate on what you have you will always have enough... If you concentrate on what you don't have you will never have enough!"

This weekend we are giving away *Little Blue Books*, a great resource for Advent, Morning or Evening Prayer. Designed to be 5 or 6 minutes of prayer, they provide a wonderful way to start a conversation with Christ the King. Jesus loves you and wants to visit with you frequently. A great gift to God is to spend time in adoration. It can be 5, 10, 15 minutes or an hour. Many of your fellow parishioners say they would not give up their time before Jesus. You learn quickly how easy it is to sit in the presence of the Lord and receive His love and grace. You are invited to talk to the One who loves you and wants you to be in heaven with Him forever. Who knows, Jesus may give you a gift of peace, serenity, and joy you have not experienced before.

Advent is also a time when we can receive the gift of reconciliation... we care for our souls... we prepare ourselves to be close to the gift of Jesus... We have a Day of Grace (many priests available all day long) scheduled... we have extra time scheduled on Saturdays. Early in life my grandfather told me a good gift to give someone is to forgive a person who has hurt you in some way. I know that is not easy! But for the person who is willing to forgive, it removes a burden from our minds and hearts.

A group of men who are at school studying hard are our seminarians. Please consider sending one, two or all of them a Christmas card thanking them for being open to the possibility of becoming a priest. Their addresses are inside the bulletin. Have each of your children sign a card and mail it. I loved getting mail from around the diocese when I was in the seminary. However, it is not very often a seminarian receives a note. One of these men may someday be a pastor at St. Philip's and St. Charles. What an easy gift, the gift of thought and prayer...

We are in the traditional beginning to the shopping, baking, gift giving, party season. Families may experience stress and concern over how much and when to spend. Take time for some quiet and peace in your home. Set aside time for hot chocolate and some of those cookies. (You can always give me one cookie, but only one as I do not need to grow physically this season!)

It is important for parents to be on the same page especially during a high stress season. Take time to have a hot drink after the kids go to bed. Make sure you set aside a certain time, the TV is off and conversation on... Sometimes it is, "dying to self" and what you want to do, but be present to the other person, it will pay dividends in the temperament around the house.



Purchase the item listed on the ornament. Do Not


wrap, rather tape the ornament to the item/items. Bring the items to the Parish Office, no later than Monday, December 17 so that they may be distributed during the Christmas season.


