April 7, 2019

We enter into April right in the middle of Lent. On April 1st, it had been 25 days since Ash Wednesday and there were 21 days until Easter Sunday. As of your reading this, we are only two weeks away from that great week of celebrating the Octave of Easter. It's a great time for us to ask the question, "Has Lent been helpful for my spiritual life so far?" Sometimes it can be easy to choose some sort of sacrifice for Lent that begins with good intentions, and then those good intentions can be forgotten. When that happens, the sacrifice loses almost all of its meaning. This is not reason for discouragement, though! It's simply a time for us to recommit to the intentions of our beginnings, to get back to our focus of spiritual growth and purification. Or perhaps you never had a spiritual intention for your Lenten practices. This is a great time to start with one. You can spend these final two weeks of Lent in a real spirit of mortification as you strive to empty yourself of all that is not fit for Heaven, so as to make more room for the Lord in your life.

During Lent there is much less of an emphasis on the saints in our liturgies. It's as though all recognition of them is overshadowed by the need we have for purification and sacrifice. The main focus during this time is meant to be on the Paschal Mystery: the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus, the Lamb of God. During those three days of the Triduum (pronounced trid-oo-um), everything else is meant to stop and marvel at the radical gift of God in the person of Jesus. Jesus goes to war against the devil by going to the Cross. Before the war, he gives us the precious gifts of the priesthood and the Eucharist at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday (April 18th). In the war, he seems to lose on Good Friday (19th), except it's in the appearance of a loss that he actually destroys the power of sin and death. His Resurrection on Easter morning (21st) reveals him to be utterly unconquerable and powerful beyond all measure. His grace explodes out of the tomb, leaving only his burial cloths behind, and into the lives of his apostles in the Upper Room. It's on the day of the Resurrection that Jesus gives yet another precious gift, namely Reconciliation (John 20:19-23). How amazing that in the midst of the war Jesus still takes time to give us these three powerful gifts of the priesthood, Eucharist, and Reconciliation!

I want to invite you to participate in these three days by attending our liturgies and keep the spirit of the days even outside of the liturgies. On Holy Thursday, before you come to Mass at 7:00 PM, find a way to rejoice in the two great gifts of the priesthood and the Eucharist. Then come to Mass and spend some extra time in prayer afterward. On Good Friday, spend the day in as much silence as possible, especially between noon and 3:00 PM. Keep the day as a day of fasting (one normal meal and, if necessary, two small meals). Come to our Good Friday liturgy at either 3:00 PM or 6:30 PM. Continue your silence and fasting into Holy Saturday, recalling that Jesus didn't rise until Easter Sunday. Finally, come and rejoice in the Resurrection at any of our Easter Masses: the Easter Vigil, a very beautiful and solemn Mass, on Saturday night at 8:30; Easter Sunday at 7:30, 9:00, or 11:00 AM (NO MASS ON SUNDAY NIGHT). Then continue to rejoice in the Resurrection for the entire Easter Octave (eight days), continuing to thank God for his power and mercy. These are holy days. Be assured of my prayers for you. Pray for me, too.

May the Lord give you his peace!






